Grants

Need based funds the student does not repay.

Work-Study

Need based award that allows the student to participate actively in meeting the cost of their education while gaining valuable work experience.

Loans

Borrowed money that must be repaid.



What Information Do I Need?



- Social Security Numbers for student and parents
- Alien Registration Number for student (if applicable)
- 2021 federal income tax returns for student and parents
- 2021 W-2s for student and parents
- Information on cash, checking and savings accounts for student and parents
- An email address other than your high school email address
- FSA IDs for student and one parent on the FAFSA

FSAID



- Used for FAFSA completion and allows access to certain U.S. Department of Education websites
- May be used by students and parents throughout the financial aid process, including subsequent school years
- Only the owner should create an FSA ID

Common Errors



- Student's name
- Social Security Numbers
- Skipping questions
- Parents' marital status
- Income earned by parent/student
- Household size
- Not signing the application
- Saving but not submitting the application

IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT)



- Allows for certain tax return information to be transferred from the IRS database
- Participation is voluntary and student chooses whether or not to transfer data to their FAFSA
- IRS will authenticate taxpayer's identity
- If tax record is found, IRS transfers information to populate the FAFSA
- Reduces documents requested by financial aid office

Important Reminders and Tips



- Apply for admissions <u>early</u> Applications are available now!
- Apply for financial aid annually on October 1st
- Apply for scholarships annually through all available sources
- Keep signed copies of tax returns and W-2s in case you are required to submit them to the financial aid office
- Check the student portal and email account for your college frequently
- Never pay anyone for assistance with the FAFSA/TASFA
