

## **IMPROVING TRANSPORTATION SAFETY!**

To enhance safety, route efficiency, and parent communication, we are partnering with BusRight, a school bus technology company that offers a bus-tracking app for parents. The BusRight Parent App allows you to track your child's bus in real time, directly from your phone. If you are the parent/guardian of a bus rider, you'll be able to create an account and view your child's bus route, live stop ETAs, and receive notifications when your child's bus starts its trip and arrives at its stop. *Continued on page 2*


Twin Rivers had a great fall semester with a lot of help from our staff and community. Thank you to everyone who helps us provide a top-notch experience for our students!

IHS swimmer Amelia McGee finished 9th in the State in both the 100 yard backstroke and 100 yard freestyle, earning All State Honorable Mention in both!




