


come to life and behaved wonderfully – making all the teachers and Pastoral Lead for Y8 immensely proud of them. A festive treat for all!


Personal Development

Careers



Careers at TBHA Term 2

We started back after October half term with a workplace visit for the students taking part in the Dare to Dream mentoring programme. 14 students received a guided tour of the First Central Insurance offices in Haywards Heath followed by a presentation to help them understand what insurance is and the jobs involved. After this, in their groups, students competed to see who could complete a virtual Escape room created by the team at First Central Insurance. We were impressed by the speed at which the students raced through the various challenges! Finally, the students had a Speed Networking challenge – speaking to 5 employees from different areas of the company and guessing which job they had. The visit was rounded up by a business lunch (the highlight of the morning for most students!). We are very grateful to our sponsors, First Central Insurance for supporting our school and most importantly, the students!

Year 7 began their introduction to careers with an engaging session of the University game. Student ambassadors from the University of Brighton came to the Academy with a board game based around life at university. In groups supported by an ambassador, students competed to see who would end the game in credit and who would need huge loans. During the game, students were given information on various aspects of student life by their ambassador! Great fun was had by all!



Year 11 students continued to hear from local colleges and sixth forms in their series of Post 16 assemblies and began to focus on making college applications. We also began a series of tutorial session based around revision techniques and preparing for their upcoming GCSE mock exams in January.

The final session of Dare to Dream took place on the 18th November and Year 9 students heard from Jack "The Lad" from More Radio and LoveLocalJobs Foundation about the importance of resilience and mental health. He encouraged students to always strive to be the best possible version of themselves and treat others kindly.



Finally, Year 10 students looked at a variety of revision techniques during sessions with the University of Brighton. Whilst it is very early into their GCSEs, it is important that students investigate which techniques will work best for them. Starting now and setting up a revision timetable, little and often can make such a difference to final outcomes for students. Not only that but starting revision now and feeling more prepared going into exams can help anxiety and mental health. If any students need assistance with creating a revision timetable, tutors will be happy to help them. This is the second of four sessions looking at a variety of study skills. We will also be teaching students vision strategies in tutor time next year in preparation for their mocks in the summer.

Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme (https://www.westsussex.gov.uk/education-children-and-families/support-for-families/holiday-activities-and-food-programme/) provides children who are eligible for benefits related Free School Meals (FSM) access to a wide range of activities and free nutritious meals over the school holidays.

Eligible children can attend their chosen HAF provision for a maximum of four days per week for one week at Easter, four weeks during the Summer and one week at Christmas. To register and book a place, please click <u>here</u>.

Free School Meals (FSM)

Is my child eligible?

Free school meals in all West Sussex maintained and free schools and academies are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
