8th Grade American History

Junior High ELA!

In 6th grade ELA, we've kicked off our third module, *Narrating the Unknown*, which focuses on the story of Jamestown. To introduce the topic and spark curiosity, students participated in an exciting *Escape Room* activity. While working collaboratively to solve clues, they not only had fun but also gained initial insights into the challenges and mysteries of early Jamestown. This engaging start has set the tone for an enriching exploration of this fascinating period in history!







In 7th grade ELA, we finished up our first module about Identity in the Middle Ages. In this module, students learned about how identity is supported and limited by their society by focusing on characters in various novels set in the Middle Ages. Within this module, the students also learned about the elements and techniques that make great narrative writing. They used this knowledge of narrative writing and applied it by creating their own narratives set in the Middle Ages. Since then, we have moved into module 2 with a focus on World War II. The students will be reading 2 novels set during this time period, Code Talker by Joseph Bruchac and Farewell To Manzanar by Jeanne Wakatsuki Houston and James D. Houston. Through reading these novels, students will learn about how World War II affected individuals and be able to write an informative essay that answers this question using evidence they gathered throughout the module. Please check in with your child periodically and ask them what effect World War II had on the people they're learning about in class.

Eighth grade students began reading *All Quiet on the Western Front* after the holiday break and have just finished Chapter 2. As part of this unit, students are exploring the novel alongside various articles about World War I to answer the essential question, "How do literature and art illuminate the effects of WWI?" After each chapter, students write "Postcards Home" to analyze the characters and key events. We will continue reading this novel throughout the third quarter.
