### LANGUAGE IMMERSION



### We wanted to share the responses to Mrs Stevens' question - 'What is your school like?' - from a small group of our Year 5 visitors from Bejing.

#### The children were given five minutes to write and then pupils and teacher improved the sentences together.

• In China we always stand up to answer questions.

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- Children do not move from one lesson to another except for the sports and practical lessons and computer lessons.
- We have 40 minute long lessons with a ten minute break between lessons. As the school is so much bigger and the building is on four floors, we don't have time to get downstairs and back again in time for lessons. We play on the corridors.
- There are six grades or year groups. There are sixteen classes in each year so that means 96 classes with 30 33 in each class. That is around 3,000 in the Primary School.
- The class teacher moves up the school with the children.
- There are regular classes in each grade and one Sports class and International class and a class for the non boarders.
- After this Primary School we go to a Middle School for years 7, 8 and 9 and then on to the High School. On the school campus there are over 300 teachers and 5000 children.
- After lunch we sleep in the classrooms for an hour in the Primary School. I mean the curtains are closed, the lights are switched off and we have to be silent.
- We drink warm water from a big bottle in the classroom.
- For our lunch we have a lot of vegetables and spices on our food and use chopsticks. The food at Moor Park is great and really tasty!
- In England we call our teachers by their first name and say "Teacher Emma", "Teacher Sylvia" and "Teacher Jacky" to the staff who are here. We have all chosen English names the teachers have too. In China we call the teachers by their surname after the title "Teacher."
