Dear Parents/Carers,

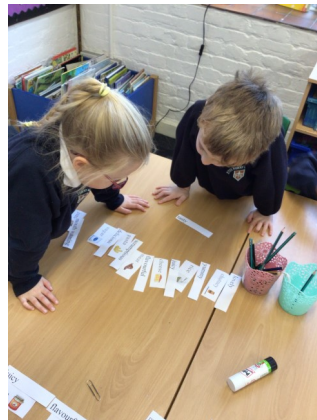

LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year 1 are still enjoying 'The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse.' They have loved coming up with adjectives to describe the food in the story. They have been sequencing the parts of the story and have been retelling the story both orally and in their writing.

Year 2 have been learning about the properties of different materials. We have considered which materials can change shape and are therefore suitable for certain purposes. In English, we have written a diary entry as Noi in The Storm Whale and we have completed setting descriptions.

Ask me: Why is a sponge suitable for washing dishes?



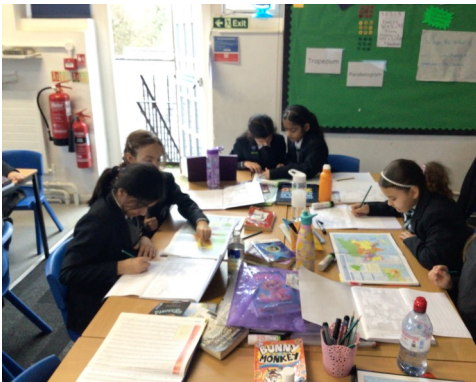
Year 3 have had an artistic week. As part of their ammonite project, they have sketched fossils, created motifs, made a two-colour print and made a sculpture out of clay inspired by nature. They have also been introduced to more complex division in maths and read more of the Iron Man in English.

Year 4 enjoyed their swimming lessons at Eton College pool. They were incredibly organised, getting ready quickly to enjoy as much time in the pool as possible. In geography, some of the children acted out the journey of a rock as it is eroded and travels down a river. They learnt about erosion, transportation and deposition. On Thursday, Year 4 took part in a badminton festival at Windsor Leisure Centre. This was a nice opportunity to develop their skills from their badminton lessons.

Ask me: To explain, erosion, transportation and deposition.



Reception had a busy week with two trips to support their new learning, We enjoyed a workshop at the Eton Life Museum, learning about toys from the past. The children discussed what toys in the past were made from and then had the opportunity to make their own skittles to play back at school. We also visited Windsor Castle where we explored the different rooms, finding cheeky dragons and then enjoyed listening to a story.
