Yes 9 No 0 Abstain 0 Motion carried SEQRA- State Environmental Quality Review Act TYPE II Resolution Regarding Seneca Falls Central School Emergency Project MOTION: WHEREAS, the Seneca Falls Central School District (the "District") plans to undertake an emergency project at a maximum estimated cost of \$145,000.00 involving the replacement of two failing rooftop units (RTU's) at Elizabeth Cady Stanton Elementary School; and, WHEREAS, in accordance with State Education Department ("SED") guidance and policy, the local school district / board of education is the appropriate agency to be the lead agency to undertake project review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"); and WHEREAS, Section 617.5 of the SEQRA regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617) provides that certain activities are Type II actions which are not subject to review under SEQRA and that such activities include "maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility" (§ 617.5(c)(1)),

"replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site" (§ 617.5(c)(2)),and/or "routine activities of educational institutions, including expansion of existing facilities by

less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area and school closings, but not changes in use related to such closings" (§ 617.5(c)(8)); and,

WHEREAS, the proposed additions and alterations project constitutes such maintenance or repair activities, and/or replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction activities, and/or routine activities of educational institutions; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the 2010 Letter of Resolution between the State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation ("OPRHP") (a/k/a State Historic Preservation Office ("SHPO")) and the SED and the Letter of Resolution's exemption form, a project is exempt from SHPO review because (i) a building(s) is less than 50 years old at the time of project initiation and it is not the work of a recognized Master Architect, Designer or Builder, or associated with persons or events significant in the history of the State of New York, or (ii) a building is 50 years old or older but has previously been evaluated by SHPO and found not to meet the criteria for inclusion in the State and National Register, or (iii) the project work on a building falls under exempt work items specified in Attachment 1 of the memo of understanding (MOU), and therefore the project will have little or no potential impact on the character of historic resources; and

WHEREAS, Elizabeth Cady Stanton Elementary School is more than 50 years old and is not the work of a recognized Master Architect, Designer or Builder, or associated with persons or events significant in the history of the State of New York and the work would be exempt under Attachment 1 of the memo of understanding (MOU), and the building is listed as not eligible for inclusion on the State and National Register according to SHPO's Cultural Resource Information System, and the District's architect therefore has determined that the exemptions identified in the paragraphs above apply to the proposed project and that it will execute the Letter of Resolution form indicating that the work to be done will have no impact on the character of historic resources and is exempt from SHPO review, and that it will include the Letter of Resolution form in the submission to the SED for the additions and alterations project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BASED ON SUCH REVIEW AND CONSIDERATION, BE IT RESOLVED by the Seneca Falls Central School District Board of Education that:

- 1. The District's Board of Education is the lead agency for the SEQRA review of the proposed additions and alterations project.
- 2. The proposed additions and alterations project is a Type II action which is not subject to review under SEQRA, and it will not result in a significant adverse impact on the environment.
- 3. This resolution is to confirm the District's SEQRA determination.
- 4. The Superintendent is hereby authorized to sign and file or have filed on behalf of the District all documents necessary to comply with SEQRA.

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Budget Workshop

Dr. Reed and Jim Bruni-Department/Building Budget Goals

Department Budget Review (July through Dec) Transportation Budget

It is important to ensure consistency in spending across years so that State Aid is consistent from year to year. The District receives 89.1% back on eligible Transportation expenditures.

- Spending in 2024 is \$64,500 higher than 2023, due to an encumbered van purchase (\$30k) and an overhaul upgrade in digital radios and GPS/Parent Mobile App for student location.
- Gas (\$50,080) vs. Diesel (\$11,182): Transition back to Diesel buses showed a reduction in gas spending, but an increase in van (gas) mileage due to more ODP students and longer routes kept it closer to 2023. Plans to increase budget 10% for 2025- 2026.
- 2023-24 Digital Radio Purchase/Contract (\$51,076)
- 2023-24 Van Purchase (\$29,998)

Maintenance Budget

- Maintenance & Custodial spending does not generate aid.
- Increase from 2023 is due to \$46,000 in encumbered purchases. Removal of encumbrances adjusts it to \$289,137.
- Electric costs are 6% above the 3-yr average (\$92,484)
- Supplies: Removal of encumbrances reflects \$68,411 in spending, right on track. This will increase in the Spring for MS Classroom furniture upgrades (\$92,257)
- Removal of encumbrances reflects \$92,250 in spending for 2024. This 52% increase is due to HVAC repairs throughout the district (\$114,405).

FY26 Budget: Plan to increase contractual and supply code, as well as a slight increase in electric costs (8%).

#### **Report on Compliance for Each Major Federal Program**

#### **Opinion on Each Major Federal Program**

We have audited Seneca Falls Central School District, Seneca Falls, New York's compliance with the types of compliance requirements identified as subject to audit in the OMB Compliance Supplement that could have a direct and material effect on each of the District's major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2024. The District's major federal programs are identified in the summary of auditor's results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs.

In our opinion, the District complied, in all material respects, with the compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2024.

#### **Basis for Opinion on Each Major Federal Program**

We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS); the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States (Government Auditing Standards); and the audit requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (Uniform Guidance). Our responsibilities under those standards and the Uniform Guidance are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of Compliance section of our report.

We are required to be independent of the District and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal program. Our audit does not provide a legal determination of the District's compliance with the compliance requirements referred to above.

#### **Responsibilities of Management for Compliance**

Management is responsible for compliance with the requirements referred to above and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of effective internal control over compliance with the requirements of laws, statutes, regulations, rules and provisions of contracts or grant agreements applicable to the District's federal programs.

#### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of Compliance

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether material noncompliance with the compliance requirements referred to above occurred, whether due to fraud or error, and express an opinion on the District's compliance based on our audit. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS, Government Auditing Standards, and the Uniform Guidance will always detect material noncompliance when it exists. The risk of not detecting material noncompliance resulting from fraud is higher than for that resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Noncompliance with the compliance requirements referred to above is considered material, if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, it would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user of the report on compliance about the District's compliance with the requirements of each major federal program as a whole.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, Government Auditing Standards, and the Uniform Guidance, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material noncompliance, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the District's compliance with the compliance requirements referred to above and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.
- Obtain an understanding of the District's internal control over compliance relevant to the audit in order to
  design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances and to test and report on internal control
  over compliance in accordance with the Uniform Guidance, but not for the purpose of expressing an

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. #### Notes to Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards

#### June 30, 2024

#### 1. <u>Basis of Presentation</u>:

The accompanying Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (the schedule) includes the federal award activity of the Seneca Falls Central School District, Seneca Falls, New York (the District) under programs of the federal government for the year ended June 30, 2024. The information in this schedule is presented in accordance with the requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirement's, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance). Because the schedule presents only a selected portion of the operations of the District, it is not intended to and does not present the financial position or changes in net position.

#### 2. <u>Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:</u>

Expenditures reported on the schedule are reported on the GAAP basis of accounting. Such expenditures are recognized following the cost principles contained in the Uniform Guidance, wherein certain types of expenditures are not allowable or are limited as to reimbursement. Negative amounts shown on the schedule represent adjustments or credits made in the normal course of business to amounts reported as expenditures in prior years.

#### 3. Indirect Costs:

The District has elected to not use the 10 percent de minimus indirect cost rate allowed under the Uniform Guidance. Indirect costs are included in the reported expenditures to the extent they are included in the federal financial reports used as the source for the data presented.

#### 4. <u>Matching Costs</u>

Matching costs, i.e., the Seneca Falls Central School District, Seneca Falls, New York's share of certain program costs, are not included in the reported expenditures.

#### 5. <u>Non-Monetary Federal Program</u>

The Seneca Falls Central School District, Seneca Falls, New York is the recipient of a federal financial award program that does not result in cash receipts or disbursements termed a "non-monetary program". ## **1120 SCHOOL DISTRICT RECORDS**

### Required

**<u>NEW NOTE</u>**: See the new section below on employee notification of disciplinary record requests.

It is the policy of the Board of Education to inform members of the public about the administration and operation of the public schools in accordance with the Freedom of Information Law of the State of New York.

The Superintendent of Schools shall develop regulations ensuring compliance with the Freedom of Information Law and setting forth the procedures to be followed to obtain access to district records, and submit such regulations to the board for approval. Such regulations shall address ensuring applicable confidentiality and security of district information. The superintendent shall designate, with board approval, a Records Access and a Records Management Officer, pursuant to law.

#### Retention and Destruction of Records

The board hereby adopts the Records Retention and Disposition Schedule ED-1 issued pursuant to <u>Article 57-A of the Arts and Cultural Affairs Law</u>, which contains the legal minimum retention periods for district records. In accordance with <u>Article 57-A</u>, the district will dispose of those records described in the schedule only after they have met the minimum retention periods set forth in the schedule. The district will dispose of only those records that do not have sufficient administrative, fiscal, legal or historical value to merit retention beyond the established legal minimum periods.

The manner of destruction will be determined by the format of the record (i.e., paper, digital, etc.). In addition, destruction will be appropriately documented.

#### Employee Notification of Disciplinary Record Requests

**NEW NOTE:** Public Officers Law §87 (part of the Freedom of Information Law (FOIL)) requires public agencies (including school districts and BOCES) to develop a policy to notify employees whenever the district is responding to a request for their disciplinary records pursuant to FOIL. To keep the related topics together, we believe it is preferable to include this information in this policy on public access to district records, rather than adopt a separate policy.

The law does not include specific elements the policy must address. An advisory opinion of the Committee on Open Government (COOG) (Advisory Opinion #19867 9/16/24) clarified some aspects of this topic, including that:

- 1. Notification should be provided to both current and former employees, based on court decisions implementing a similar law for law enforcement disciplinary records.
- 2. Notification should be provided after information has been released.

- 3. Notification should be provided in writing so there is evidence of the district's compliance with the law. Regular mail or email is sufficient.
- 4. Reasonable efforts to notify former employees should be made, and efforts documented.
- 5. The notice does not need to include a copy of the FOIL request or the actual records provided, but the district can do so. However, note that FOIL requests and responses themselves are district records subject to FOIL access rights.
- 6. As "disciplinary records" is not defined for this purpose, public agencies could use the definition of "law enforcement disciplinary records" in Public Officers Law §86(6). We have done so in this policy, to the extent applicable to school districts.

We believe that if there is nothing in an employee's disciplinary records, the district would still need to notify the employee of the request after its response. We suggest including a timeframe of when to provide the employee notice.

As required by Public Officers Law §87, the district will notify current and former employees in writing that the district has responded to a Freedom of Information Law request for their disciplinary records within **5** working days after the district provides information in response to the request. For former employees, the district will send notification to the last known address or email address, and if current contact information cannot be found, the district will document its attempts.

For purposes of this policy, the district defines "disciplinary records" as any record created in furtherance of a disciplinary proceeding (i.e., any investigation and subsequent hearing or disciplinary action conducted by the district), including but not limited to:

- 1. The complaints, allegations, and charges against an employee;
- 2. The name of the employee complained of or charged;
- 3. <u>The transcript of any disciplinary hearing, including any exhibits introduced at such hearing;</u>
- 4. The disposition of any disciplinary proceeding; and
- 5. The final written opinion or memorandum supporting the disposition and discipline imposed including the district's complete factual findings and its analysis of the conduct and appropriate discipline of the employee.

### Litigation-Hold

The superintendent will establish procedures in the event that the school district is served with legal papers. The superintendent will communicate with applicable parties, including the school attorney and the records management official, to ensure that, when appropriate, a litigation-hold is properly implemented. The litigation-hold is intended to prevent the destruction or disposal of records that may need to be produced as part of discovery. It is the intention of the Board of Education to comply with applicable rules and regulations regarding the production of necessary documents, data, files, etc. The Board directs the Superintendent to institute such procedures to implement this policy.

The Superintendent or his/her designee, with assistance from the Records Management Officer, shall be responsible for developing and disseminating department-specific retention schedules and guidance to staff, as necessary, to ensure adherence to this policy.
