

English IV Core English Classes

Prep Options

Year-Long course (one option):

1. World Perspectives in Literature

- Have the same teacher for the entire year. Explore ideas of justice, the search for meaning, imagination and more through various genres of fiction and non-fiction.

Semester Courses (five options - choose two of following):

1. Creating and Reflecting

- Develop your curiosity and ability to reflect. Like art? This class will work on your reading, writing, and thinking skills and will tap into your creative side.

2. The Visual Word

- Study literature through the interpretation of filmmaking and films. This is not just a watching the movie class! You will be expected to analyze, discuss, and write about cinematography and the devices used in film.

3. The Literary Tradition of Comedy

- Explore humor in plays, essays, novels, and poetry in this class.

4. Multicultural American Literature

- Interested in questions of identity, representation, and other relevant themes? Take a deeper dive into the study of literature through the lens of diverse authors and protagonists.

5. Composition

- Develop your writing skills before you leave for college or career!

English IV Core English Classes

AP Options

1. English IV AP: Rhetoric of {Language and Composition}

The capstone class for a student in Accel, typically.

Prepares you for the AP Language and Composition exam

Thematically taught and focused on the use of rhetoric in fiction and non-fiction, specifically the power of argument - 1.0 Credits

2. English IV AP: Literature and Composition

The capstone class for a student in Honors/AP.

Prerequisite – English III AP Language and Composition or recommendation

Prepares you for the AP Literature and Composition exam

Focuses on literary analysis and the close reading of a variety of fiction and non-fiction genres - 1.0 Credits

(Please see the APG for further descriptions regarding the above courses.)

Dual Credit English Options

- **English IV Honors: Reading, Writing, and Inquiry ACP**

- This is an Indiana University composition course that will be offered FALL SEMESTER ONLY. Students can earn 3 hours of college credit.
- Prerequisite: Successful completion of junior English (C or better) and an overall unweighted GPA of 2.7. This course is open to students in all levels.

- **English IV Honors: Literary Interpretation**

- This is a one semester Indiana University course designed to help students learn how to read, think, and write critically and cogently about literature. It will be offered during the SPRING SEMESTER ONLY. Students can earn 3 hours of IU credit.
- Prerequisites:
 - Successful completion of the English IV Honors: Reading, Writing, and Inquiry ACP course (C or better) and a cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.7.
 - *If a student doesn't want to take the English IV Honors: Reading, Writing, and Inquiry ACP course in the fall semester, then the prerequisite is the following (Note: These are challenging prerequisites):
A cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.7 AND A score of 4 or higher on the AP Lang and Comp test OR an English ACT score of 32 or higher OR an SAT ERBW score of 710 or higher.

Students earn Level V credit for these courses. Please refer to the dual credit handouts for more information

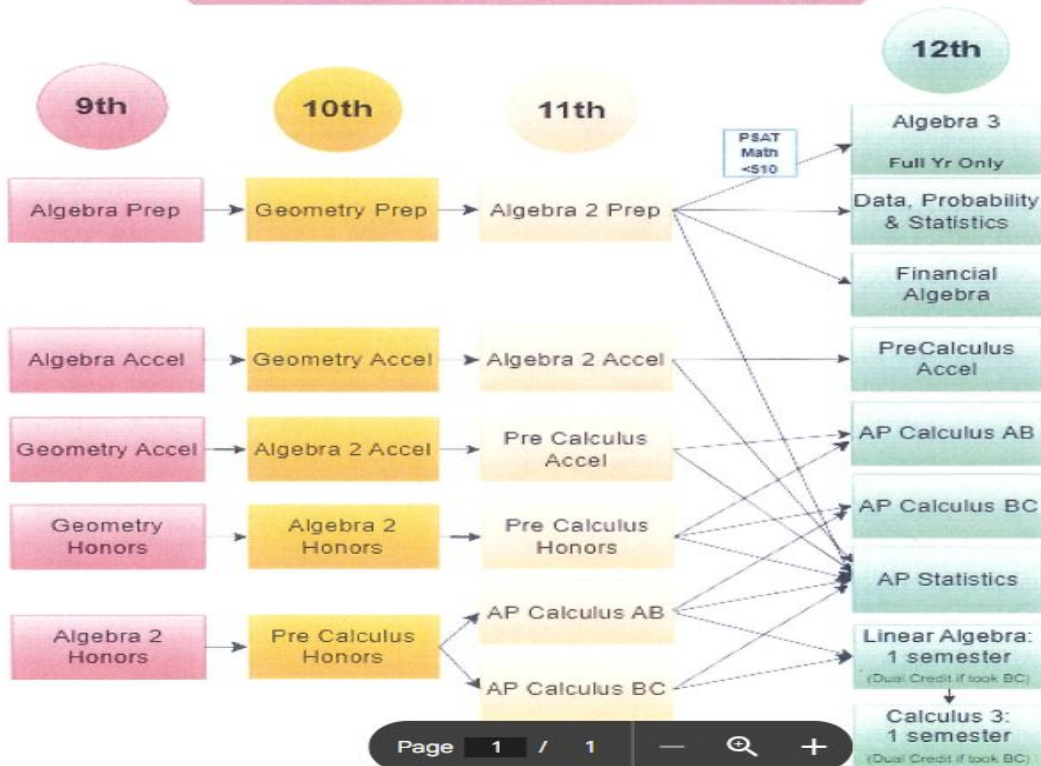

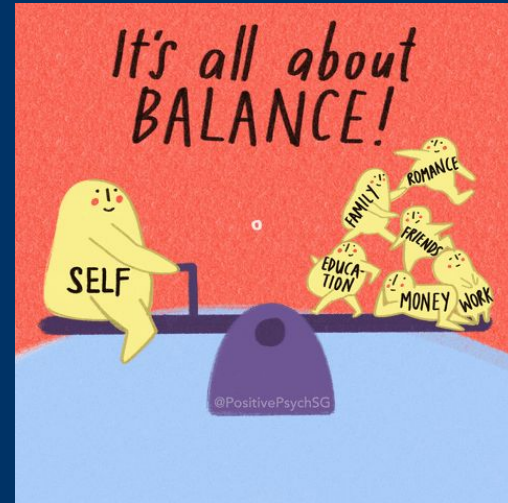


Registration Advice *from our college coordinator*

Adaptive PE Leaders

- ★ Available for Sophomore & NC students.
- ★ Meets PE credit
- ★ There is an application process and form that students need to complete by 1/31 in order to be eligible to take the class.
- ★ Ideal class for students that are in Best Buddies or otherwise have a desire to work with students with special needs.
- ★ Students will learn about how to support students with various disabilities, how to modify activities, and how to provide accommodations.
- ★ Students will eventually work hands-on with students in LIFE PE

PE Elective Information

Advance Self- Defense

- Available for Senior students
- Meets PE credit
- Students are NOT eligible for Athletic Study Hall
- Open to any student that identifies as female or non-binary
- Students need tove successfully completed Basic Self-Defense
- Course cannot be repeated.

Basic Self-Defense (F)

- Available for Junior or Senior students
- Meets PE credit
- Students are NOT eligible for Athletic Study Hall
- Open to any student that identifies as female or non-binary
- Physical components are focused on avoiding and escaping physical assault. Physical defense is taught as a last resort.
- Classroom components: addressing gender roles in society, health relationships, positive coping mechanisms, and how to recognize risk and reduce assault probability.
- Dual Credit option from COD.
- Course cannot be repeated.

Basic Self-Defense (M)

- Available for Junior or Senior students
- Meets PE credit
- Students are NOT eligible for Athletic Study Hall
- Open to any student that identifies as male or non-binary
- Different skills/tactics than female/non-binary class.
- Less skills/tactics than female/non-binary class - only 50% of class.
 - Fitness concepts/training will be the other 50% of class.
- Course cannot be repeated.



PE Elective Information

Applied Personal Fitness

- Available for Junior or Senior students
- Meets PE credit
- Students are NOT eligible to attend Athletic Study hall
- Students are graded primarily on their Heart Rate monitor data.
- This class is based on student performances in cardiovascular workouts

Exercise Physiology

- Available for Junior or Senior students
- Meets PE Credit
- Level IV Class
- 80% Lab and Lecture (4 days lecture)
- Homework, labs and tests
- 20% Fitness Activities w/ Heart Rate Monitor (1 day of engagement)
- This semester course is for the student interested in the scientific explanation of human performance. It is primarily a lab course with experiments in body composition, cardiovascular function, and the energy supply systems for various activities.
- Students are NOT eligible for study hall.
- The textbook is a college level text.



PE Elective Information

Dance Arts

- ★ Available for Junior or Senior students who have taken Dance Studies & Fitness or Dance Fitness
- ★ Meets PE or Creative Arts Credit at North Campus.
- ★ Deeper knowledge of dance technique in Ballet, Modern and Jazz.
- ★ Opportunities for dance choreography and production.
- ★ Students are NOT eligible for athletic study hall.

Dance Fitness

- ★ Available for Junior or Senior students
- ★ Meets PE Credit at North Campus.
- ★ Dance Fitness allows for athletic study hall.
- ★ Fitness activities in a dance setting.
- ★ Will include group exercise, Yoga, Pilates and Zumba dances.

PE Elective Information

PE III/IV - Adventure Education

- Students will engage in team building and cooperative games, Kayaking, Rock Climbing, and High Ropes.
- Fitness concepts and activities are mixed into the class to make roughly a 50/50 split in games and fitness.



PE III/IV - Strength Training

- Students will learn in depth knowledge of strength training techniques and will engage in regular workouts to build strength towards individual goals.
- Fitness concepts and activities are mixed into the class to make roughly a 50/50 split in games and fitness

PE III/IV - Individual/Leisure Sports

- Traditional PE Track with team activities such as: Golf, Badminton/Pickleball, Volleyball, and Softball.
- Fitness concepts and activities are mixed into the class to make roughly a 50/50 split in games and fitness

PE III/IV - Team Sport

- Traditional PE Track with team activities such as: Flag Football, Floor Hockey, Volleyball, Basketball, and Softball.
- Fitness concepts and activities are mixed into the class to make roughly a 50/50 split in games and fitness.



PE Elective Information

Introduction to Sports Medicine

- Available for Junior or Senior students
- **Does NOT meet the PE credit**
- Level 4 class
- **Student should have a B or better in Health**
- Great for students contemplating medical careers, athletic training or to gain practical knowledge and skills for recreational athletes

Sports Officiating

- Available for Junior or Senior students
- Meets PE credit
- The class may be repeated
- **Students ARE eligible to attend Athletic Study Hall**
- Students will play and learn how to officiate: Basketball, Volleyball, Soccer (Fall), Softball (Spring)
- Students will be graded on their officiating skills as well as class engagement.
- Students will have the opportunity to develop skills in order to become a certified official and may be able to take advantage of employment opportunities that exist for officials



PE Elective Information

Scuba I

- Available for Junior or Senior students
- Meets PE Credit
- Students are NOT eligible for athletic study hall
- Class may be taken only once during either the JR or SR year.
- The goal of this class is to have students complete their PADI open water certification.
- A grade of “C” or better in PE and Health is required.
- Students will need a PADI medical waiver signed off by a physician prior to the start of class.
- The course cannot be repeated

Scuba II

- Available to Senior students who had an A in Scuba I and completed their PADI open water certification.
- Meets PE Credit
- Students are NOT eligible for athletic study hall
- The goal of this class is to have students complete their PADI open water certification.
- Students will need a PADI medical waiver signed off by a physician prior to the start of class.
- The course cannot be repeated.
- *In this course they will serve in a leadership role for Scuba I students and will be independently working to complete their PADI Advanced Certification.*

- Available for Junior or Senior students
- Meets PE credit
- *The class cannot be repeated*
- Students ARE eligible to attend Athletic Study Hall
