WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?



- Dual enrollment program allows <u>eligible</u> high school students to earn college credit while working on their high school diploma.
- The approved course list is available on Gafutures.org for both technical and 4 year colleges and universities.







ELIGIBILITY

★ 9th Grade- Ineligible

★ 10th Grade

- May enroll in Career, Technical and Agricultural Education (CTAE) courses at a participating Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) institution only.
- High Achievers- SAT score of 1200 or an ACT score of 26, may enroll in any approved Dual Enrollment courses at a TCSG, USG or private eligible participating postsecondary institution.







ELIGIBILITY

★ IIth & I2th Grade

 Must meet post-secondary admission requirements to take any approved Dual Enrollment courses at an eligible USG,TCSG or private institution until they reach their capped number of hours.







BENEFITS

- ★ Increases exposure to college-level classes while still in high school
- Allows students with specific goals (academic or career) greater flexibility to attain those goals
- **May provide an easier transition from high school to college**
- ★ Reduced costs to the student and/or families: covers tuition, mandatory fees, and required textbooks (professor recommended books may not be covered)
- ★ Students receive both high school and post-secondary credit at the same time
- Students can attend multiple colleges/universities, but must not exceed the 15 hours per semester or 12 hours per quarter.
- Students can participate in any high school extracurricular activity, even if they are full time DE.





AREYOU READY FOR DE?

Consider the following:

- Are you eligible to participate in Dual Enrollment?
- Are you self-motivated, take initiative?
- Are you proactive in completing assignments and studying?
- Are you diligent in reporting to class on time?
- Are you an independent learner?

- Are you able to maintain positive academic behavior while involved in extracurricular activities?







Dual Enrollment Courses: Part-time or Full-Time

Part-Time

- Fewer than 12 credit hours per semester
- Blend of Dual Enrollment courses at the college and high school courses
- Students are still enrolled at a HCS high school and eligible to participate in sports, extracurricular activities, clubs, and events.

Full Time

- Total of 12-15 credit hours per semester Classes are taken on the
- college/university campus, online or HCS Site and may take high school courses at the high school
- Students are still enrolled at a HCS high school and eligible to participate in sports, extracurricular activities, clubs, and events.





How many classes/hours can a student enroll?

★ Term Cap- 15 hours per semester or 12 hours per quarter

- Participation and funding is capped at 30 semester or 45 quarter hours
- ★ Accelerated Career Diploma Program
 - 30-hour funding cap
- Students who have reached the DE funding cap may be eligible for HOPE Grant and HOPE Career Grant Programs at TCSG institutions.





HOW DOES DE WORK?

★ Information Gathering

- Advisement regarding Dual Enrollment must be provided to all students grades
 8-12 regarding DE by February 1st.
- Students in grades 8-11 must complete their Naviance task for Dual Enrollment
- Process
 - Students must apply and be accepted to the post-secondary institution they wish to attend.
 - Students will need to complete an <u>ONLINE</u> DE Funding Application each semester or quarter and Participation Agreement once per year (unless the student changes schools).





HOW DOES DE WORK?

\star Process

- Students enrolling in <u>approved</u> DE courses through University System of Georgia (USG) and Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG), or private institutions will not pay any tuition or mandatory fees; books will be provided
 - https://www.gafutures.org/checs/dualenrollment/DECourseDirectory
- However, there may be course specific fees, such as lab fees, that will still be the responsibility of the student.







HOW DOES DE WORK?

★ Process

- DE courses do not count toward your HOPE SCHOLARSHIP/ZELL MILLER CAP hours and do not count in the College HOPE eligibility GPA calculations (after a student is enrolled in college) but the DE courses <u>DO</u> count into the High School HOPE GPA calculation and therefore, a student's initial HOPE eligibility when graduating high school and entering college as a college student.
- While you are in high school and creating your HOPE GPA, these DE courses are calculated into your GPA.





HOW DOES DE WORK?

🛧 Process

- Students who have reached the Dual Enrollment Funding Cap may elect to begin using hours from HOPE Grant and HOPE Career Grant Programs.

- Students taking at least 12 semester hours or 15 quarter hours are considered full time DE students and may not need additional classes at their home school (Math has special criteria).
- Satisfactory academic progress (SAP) at the college is required to continue participating in DE.







WITHDRAWAL & RETAKE POLICIES

- Students may not receive funding for the same DE course twice. DE courses (passed/ failed/withdrawn) cannot be retaken and receive funding.
- ★ Grades of <u>W,WD or WF</u> (withdrawal from a course) given at the college will equate to a "F" on the high school transcript.
- ★ Students become ineligible to continue to receive funding from the program after their 2nd withdrawal.
- Students who wish to retake a course or continue participating after 2 withdrawals may request an Extenuating Circumstance Exception.





DE Opportunities: WHEN DO YOU SELF-PAY?

- The term in which the student reaches the Funding Cap (30 hours), the Eligible Postsecondary Institution may charge Tuition and a prorated portion of the Mandatory Fees and book costs, based on credit hours not covered by Dual Enrollment funding.
- The Eligible Postsecondary Institution may charge for courses that do not appear on the approved course directory but which the student chooses to enroll: 11th & 12th grade only
- A student is ineligible to receive Dual Enrollment funding payment, for courses not specific to their grade level eligibility (i.e. 9th and potentially 10th)
- ★ Student is ineligible to receive Dual Enrollment funding to repeat or retake a course.

- ★ If a student officially or unofficially withdraws or drops out prior to the postsecondary institutions' drop/add period, he or she is ineligible to receive Dual Enrollment program funding payment for that school term. Students that drop out during the drop/add period are subject to the provisions in accordance with Section 1612 of Dual Enrollment Regulations (See 2025-2026 DE Regulations).
- ★ Student becomes ineligible to continue receiving Dual Enrollment program funding after their second (2nd) course withdrawal from an approved Dual Enrollment course(s), occurring Summer term 2020 or later, regardless of the total Paid Hours or Funding Cap calculation.



Dual Enrollment Self-Pay Guidelines

է Defined

• A Self Pay Dual Credit Course is a post-secondary course, including a virtual course, taken by an eligible high school student pursuant and an eligible postsecondary institution.

Hours

 Students who wish to take more than the funded 30 DE courses must self-pay required tuition, fees, books, and any other related expenses. Courses must be chosen from the DE course directory or a list of approved self-pay dual credit courses.

Tuition

 The parent/student is responsible for tuition and fees for any course taken that is not on the approved DE Course Directory or on the student's DE application. Please communicate with the school counselor as some courses are not eligible for high school credit.

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Process

Before registering for Self Pay Dual Credit Courses, students must complete and submit the <u>Self-Pay Course</u>
 <u>Approval Form</u> to the high school counselor before paying for any college courses, textbooks, and fees.





Accelerated Career Diploma Program







Accelerated Career Diploma Program

- ★ Accelerated Career pathways offer qualified students (10-12th grades) a unique path to high school graduation. Students choose to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and a college Associate of Applied Science Degree, Technical Diploma, a program leading to Licensure or two (2) Technical Certificates of Credit (TCC's) in a specific career pathway.
- ★ Accelerated Career students do NOT complete the 23 credits required of traditional high school students and are not the ones planning to move straight to a 4-year college. If students are considering a 4 year college as part of their future plan, Accelerated Career is not their best option.





Accelerated Career Diploma

Students participating in the Accelerated Career Diploma Program will receive funds from the **ACE Grant**.

- \star only to be used for TCSG units
- ★ no residency requirement (unlike HOPE grant)
- ★ Budgeted separately from academic dual enrollment
- ★ not capped at 30 hours
- \star students may retake classes they failed
- \star student may have more than two withdrawals
- ★ Hours do not count toward 127 combined CAP for HOPE Scholarship/Grant funds
- ★ Application & Funding Process
 - students complete the <u>GSFAPP application</u> to access their Accelerated Career Education (ACE) Grant Program funds.



Articulation

The purpose of the Articulated Credit Agreement Initiative between the Georgia Department of Education and the Technical College System of Georgia is to provide Georgia's students with the opportunity to receive college credit as a result of successful completion of specific CTAE high school courses taken in a CTAE pathway and an external assessment or credential in that pathway. These agreements recognize the efforts of students while in high school and allows them to receive credentialing in their chosen field more guickly and without duplication of coursework between high school and technical college curriculum.

Steps for Accessing and Receiving Articulated Credit

Step 1- Successfully complete the required courses in your chosen CTAE pathway to qualify for the articulated credit

Step 2- Successfully pass the required credentialing assessment, exam, or demonstration required to earn the articulated credit

Step 3- During your senior year, apply to the Technical College of your choice

Step 4- Ask your counselor for the Articulated Credit Verification Form and fill it out. Upload the Verification Form and Exam/Credential Certificate with your TCSG application

Step 5- Receive acceptance from the Technical College of your choice (Additional documentation or demonstration may be required by the local TCSG institution for the credit to be awarded)

DEAPPLICATION PROCESS

- I. Parent and student must meet with their counselor to discuss DE interests/options and graduation requirements.
- 2. Student must take the appropriate test (i.e. SAT, ACT, ACCUPLACER) to gain admission into the university/college.
- 3. Student must meet GPA requirements for college admission.
- 4. Student must submit all required documentation to the college/university.
- 5. After acceptance is received, the student and parent meet with school counselor to discuss course options and complete any applicable course registration and agreements (mandatory).





DEAPPLICATION PROCESS

- 6. After acceptance is received, the student completes the DE Funding/online application (GAfutures.org).
- 7. Student registers for DE classes with the college advisor based on courses approved by the <u>high school counselor at least 10 days prior to</u> the university deadline.
- 8. Students obtain a copy of the college schedule and gives a copy to the high school counselor for verification of graduation requirements.
- 9. At the end of the semester/quarter, the college will provide the high school counselor with a copy of the transcript; however, the student can also provide the college/university official transcript to the counselor.
- Steps I-9 must be repeated each semester or quarter a student wishes to enroll in DE.

- ★ All students complete the online Dual Enrollment funding application in GAFutures.
 - \circ No paper version



- ★ Students complete one application per program year.
 - Program year goes from Summer term to Spring term
 - Unless student changes high schools or home study programs during the year, then must complete a second application
- ★ As part of the application, student completes the participation agreement and provides parent's email.






★ After the student submits their online Dual Enrollment Funding application, the parent/guardian must complete the participation agreement before the high school can process the application for approved courses.



- ★ Neither the high school nor the college/university can process a student application until the parent agrees to student participation in Dual Enrollment.
- ★ Separately, students must complete the college admissions application process as well.

Where Do I Start?

1. Meet with high school School Counselor

2. Complete CSU DE Application for Admission, Submit Test Scores, High School transcript or any other college transcript



- Summer Semester:
 - Priority* Deadline April 15

- Applying early ensures timely decision notifications, providing more time to plan and reducing the stress associated with waiting for admission decisions.

Distance Computer Science

CS 1301: Introduction to Computing

Pre-requisites: At least two college level (AP or DE) classes, precalculus, and classroom or extracurricular experience with computers

- CS 1331: Introduction to Object-Oriented Programming
 Pre-requisites: CS 1301 or AP Computer Science A score of 4+ and proficiency in Python
- Each is a one-semester course. To take both, students must apply for both. Offered summer, fall, or spring semesters
- Fully on-line: recorded lectures, optional recitations, online discussion forums
- Program allows students to join Fall, Spring, or Summer semesters
- Admission: must have two college courses (AP or DE) and precalculus

Distance Math

- Year One: Linear Algebra (MATH 1554) Fall semester and Multivariable Calculus (MATH 2551) Spring semester
 - Pre-requisites: AP Calculus BC with test score of 4+ or Dual Enrollment Calculus I and II
 - Hybrid delivery with pre-recorded lectures and live studio sessions
 - Tests are proctored at high school
- Year Two: Applied Combinatorics (MATH 3012) Fall semester and Differential Equations (MATH 2552) Spring semester
 - Pre-requisites: Year One or Dual Enrollment of Year One courses
 - Asynchronous online delivery
 - Tests are proctored at high school

• PSYC 1101: General Psychology

- PSYC 2103: Introduction to Human Development
- PSYC 2210: Social Psychology

- Each is a one-semester course. To take more than one, students must apply for more than one. Offered fall or spring semesters
- Fully on-line: recorded lectures, tests proctored with Honorlock
- Admission: must have two college courses (AP or DE) and precalculus. PSYC 1101 is a prerequisite for the other courses

On-Campus Dual Enrollment

- Limited to 20 students per year
- Registration not guaranteed in any particular classes. Students cannot count on taking classes needed for graduation
- Intended for students who have exhausted high school curriculum in math and/or science.
- Logistics:
 - Commuting and parking
 - Nearly all classes at Tech are offered mid-morning.
 - Nearly all labs are late afternoon.

Dual Enrollment Overview

- •Dual Enrollment students take college classes while still in high school—these courses can be either academic or technical
- High School Credit + College Credit = 1 College Class
- •Dual Enrollment funds cover tuition, textbooks, course materials and most college fees/expenses
- •Degree Level Core Courses Transfer to USG colleges ie ENGL 1101, HIST 2111, POLS 1101, MATH 1111







Eligibility Requirements

- •Must be a 10th, 11th, or 12th grade student
- Must have minimum 2.0 GPA
- •Must submit an SCTC application for admissions online at sctech.edu
- •Must speak with high school counselor to complete necessary steps







2024-2025 Course Options

- •Logistics, Computer Classes, Nursing, Business Management, Criminal Justice, Automotive, Phlebotomy, Cardiovascular Technology, Water Quality, Industrial Systems Technology, and Core Academics—available at SCTC's Henry County Center

Dual Enrollment

- The offering of college courses to high school students looking to excel
- Offered to rising juniors and seniors
- Must have the approval from HS counselor and parent/guardian
- Students are enrolled as Non-Degree seeking student type (no major is assigned)
- If student wants to pursue the Associates pathway will be declared when applying for graduation
- Students can take classes during the regular Fall, Spring, or Summer semesters







Dual Enrollment Costs

- Tuition is covered by Georgia Student Finance Commission (GFCS)
- Courses must be selected from state approved list
- Non-funded classes must be paid for at the time of registration
- Mandatory university fees are waived
- Textbooks are provided on loan basis through the bookstore, but must be returned in good condition.
- Student Responsibilities:
 - Course specific fees: (Ex: science or foreign language)
 - > Transportation
 - Parking and meals

REMINDERS

- Meet with your school counselor
- ★ Obtain acceptance by the University/College for Dual Enrollment
- ★ Complete the student & parent sections of the DE online application
- ★ Complete the participation agreement and HCS Checklist with the school counselor.
- ★ The school counselor must be informed of any changes.
- ★ Grades of <u>W, WD or WF</u> (withdrawal from a course) given at the college will equate to a "F" on the high school transcript, unless there are extenuating circumstances.
- ★ Make sure your counselor receives a copy of the transcript at the end of each semester or quarter.





REMINDERS

- Contact the counselor for participating in DE for the following semester.
- ★ Follow all deadlines for the college/university. All information must be completed and school counselor must have all information to enter into the funding application 10 days prior to the college's deadline.
- Make sure you balance your high school and college courses, if you enroll in both.
