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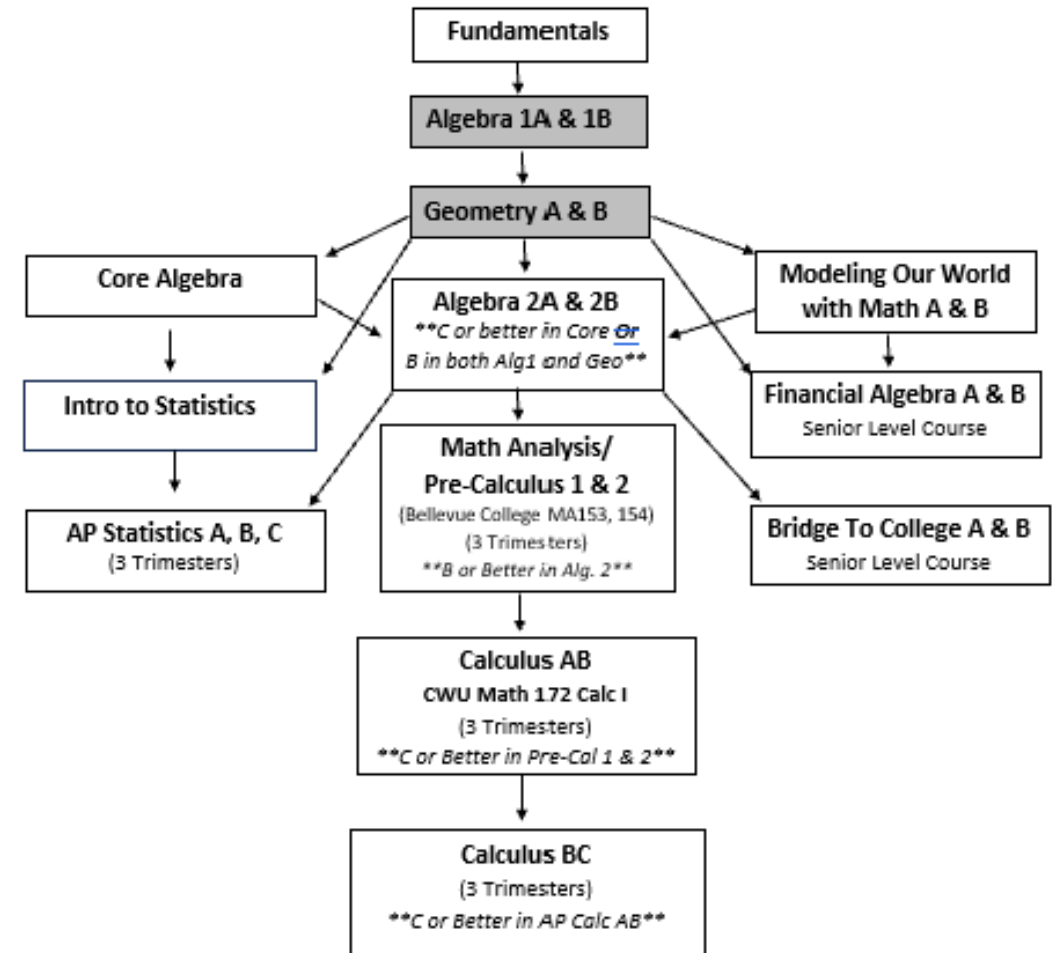
Math

- Your Math Teacher should have already met with you.
- The two of you should have discussed options for your math class for next year.
- You must have met the course prerequisite in order to register for the class.

MATH PLACEMENT 2025-2026

Key Notes:

- Graduation Requirements:
 - Algebra 1A/B, Geometry A/B, and 1.0 credit of a 3rd year math option.
 - Minimum 3 years of math required.
- Algebra 2 A/B is required for eligibility to 4-year universities.
- Math department recommendations: See asterisks **
It is recommended that students do not move on to the next class in the sequence until they have completed the previous class at the recommended grade level.





Math - it is important

Even if you have already completed your three years of Math

– it is extremely wise to continue to take Math your Senior year.

- **University:** A senior year of math is required for direct admission.
- **Community College:** You want to be able to test into college level math. Tuition is expensive. Learn your math here for free.
- **Technical College/Apprenticeships:** Math skills are required for most trades.
- **Military:** As part of the recruiting process to join the military they will have you take a placement exam called the ASVAB. How you do on the ASVAB is used to determine the job that the military will train you to do. You want them to think you are smart so that you are trained for a good job.
