PAYMENT INFORMATION

Online payment through RevTrack will be linked on the registration form. Checks are also accepted and must be mailed to the VPA office.

Checks must be made out to "CCSD" and include student's name and "SUMMER SMAART" in the memo line.

COST

The program fee is \$200. Bus transportation is an additional \$100 and is optional. There is no cost for students that attend a Title I school and request a scholarship.

<u>LUNCH</u>

Students can bring their own lunch if preferred. However, breakfast and lunch are provided at no cost. We encourage those bringing their own lunch to be mindful of allergies, particularly to nuts.

REGISTRATION

Registration opens online on Monday, January 27 at 8:00 am. The registration form will be available at ccsdschools.com/vpa

Space is limited. Students will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis based on their artistically identified area. Some classes fill up early, so please register ASAP!

Once a major area has been filled, students will be placed in their 2nd or 3rd choice major per the registration from. On the registration form, select the MAJOR class your child would most like to attend.

You will be notified by April 9, 2025 whether or not your child has been accepted into their first class choice.

Please check eligible Grade Levels and your child's identified Artistically Gifted & Talented area (s) before registering.

TRANSPORTATION

Optional transportation via CCSD School buses is available for a fee of \$100, which can be paid with your student's registration

Students must register for transportation to ride the bus.

Bus stops will be located at <u>CCSD</u> <u>Schools</u> across the District and will be determined when student needs have been finalized. If applying for the bus, please indicate the <u>school</u> you would like to use as a bus stop.

Please note: Your exact selection may not be the actual stop - routes are built based on requests.

WAIT LIST

Students not accepted in a class due to it being at capacity will be placed on a waiting list.

COMMITMENT

Students will spend the majority of their time in their MAJOR (student selected), while still receiving instruction in MINORS (staff selected)


Students should choose which class they prefer for their MAJOR. Minor classes will be selected by the SMAART facilitators

Rising 4th - 8th Graders


Sign up for a taste of the Islands this summer! Participants will learn to play traditional steel drums in an ensemble of 15-20 participants.

ABSTRACT & ACTION ART-MAKING

Rising 4th Graders Only

Want to paint with something other than a paintbrush? Want to move and jump around while making art?

In Abstract & Action Art-Making, students will explore unusual methods of drawing and painting through action and movement.

Using materials not typically associated with artmaking (bubble wrap, toy cars, sticks, leaves, and so much more!), our artists will take a deep dive into their own minds to create gestural abstract artwork.

FIBERT ART CREATION

Rising 4th Graders Only

In this course, students will learn how to create art using nontraditional materials. We will cover more commonly known skills such as weaving, hand-sewing, and embroidery art. Students will create their own artwork out of yarn, fabric, felt, paint, and more!

DIGITAL MULTIMEDIA

Rising 5th - 6th Graders

Love creating with technology? Participants will explore various realms of multimedia, including inventing with Makey Makey kits and coding on Scratch. We will also use iPads, iMovie, Green Screen, and Garage Band. Participants will engage in activities that involve discovery, creativity, digital artistry, and invention.

MAKE IT LOOK REAL

Section 1: Rising 4th Graders Only Section 2: Rising 5th - 6th Graders

This course is designed for students who want to learn how to make objects that they draw look real via the use of perspective.

The first part of the course features drawing lessons about using "one-point perspective" and "value." This lesson gives students the opportunity to create the appearance of 3-dimentional shapes on a flat surface. For inspiration, we will look at work created by artists like M.C. Escher.

The second part of the course will feature lessons on how to use perspective while creating landscape paintings. We'll take a deep-dive into using foreground, middle-ground, and background to show perspective. Students will also create a "Desert Landscape" and a "Low Country Landscape" using watercolor paints and watercolor techniques.

PERFORMANCE ART


Rising 5th - 6th Graders

Sometimes artwork does not stand still. In this class, students will experiment with using the human body to create art!

We will make wearable art masks and learn the basics of face painting. Some of our planned projects include calligraphy dancing, painting music, and mimicking famous works of art with props and live models.

Students will be immersed in a visual arts focus to explore its connections between dance, drama, and music.





MIXED MEDIA MAYHEM

Section 1: Rising 5th - 6th Graders Section 2: Rising 7th - 8th Graders

In this course, students will be able to create a variety of mixed media works of art. Mixed media is artwork in which more than one medium or material has been used.

Printmaking, assemblage, collage, and cardboard sculpture are some of the creative methods that you can expect from this fun-filled course!

FUNDAMENTALS OF PRINTMAKING

Rising 7th - 8th Graders

This hands-on workshop will introduce middle school students to the basics of printmaking -- from designing prints to using traditional tools and techniques. Students will also explore various methods such as monoprinting and linocut to create their own unique artwork.

This course is perfect for young artists looking to express their creativity and learn something new -- all while experimenting and having fun with printmaking!



VISUAL ARTS

TACKLING TEXTILES

Rising 7th - 8th Graders

In this course, students will learn how to create art using nontraditional materials.

We will cover more commonly known skills such as weaving, knitting, and sewing, while also learning about the art of yarn painting and fabric portraiture.

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY

Rising 7th - 8th Graders

This course will cover the basic concepts and practices of digital photography. Students will learn how to create a vision through composition and lighting.

No prior photography experience is needed and all materials will be provided.
