District Academic Opportunities

Career Internship is a credit-bearing program for juniors and seniors who participate in a 75-hour internship in the Rochester area.


Community Service is a credit-bearing program for students who volunteer for approved organizations, individuals, and groups needing assistance.

Network of Complementary Schools allows students to experience specialized study in a variety of settings for two to three weeks. Pittsford Sutherland High School is one of 21 public/private schools throughout the United States and Puerto Rico who participate in this network.

Project Lead the Way helps students explore the field of engineering. Courses include: Principles of Engineering, Design & Drawing for Production, Computer Aided Drawing (CAD), Digital Electronics, Computer Integrated Manufacturing, Computer Science and Software Engineering.

Curriculum

Recognized for educational excellence, Pittsford Central Schools provide a rigorous and engaging curriculum to meet the needs of a talented student population. Curricular offerings range from Honors and AP classes in all major academic areas to Regents level collaborative instruction for students requiring additional academic support. Students can choose from approximately 160 courses, which meet for 40 minutes five times per week.

Advanced Placement (AP) classes can include: Art History, Music Theory, English Literature, American History, European History, World History, Language and Composition, Environmental Science, Government and Politics, Micro- and Macro-Economics, Psychology, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Calculus, Statistics, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, Latin, French, Spanish, and Studio Drawing.

Honors courses can include: English 9, 10, 11, Survey of British Literature, Geometry, Algebra 2/Trigonometry, Pre Calculus, College Physics, French 3, 4, Spanish 3, 4, and Latin Literature.

Regents level laboratory sciences meet one extra period per cycle and Advanced Placement science classes meet for two extra periods.
