GPA & RANKING

A yearly GPA is calculated on a 4.8 scale weighted by .3 increase in value for Honors courses (A = 4.3), and by .5 for AP courses (A = 4.5). Initial GPA reported represents the cumulative 9th - 11th grades earned.

For the Class of 2025, the highest GPA is 4.574 with a median GPA of 3.629. By policy, Mount Greylock does not rank.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Mt. Greylock Regional School is a six-year, public secondary school comprising grades 7-12 located in the college town of Williamstown in the northwest corner of Massachusetts bordering New York and Vermont. The regional district comprises two communities, Williamstown and Lanesborough, representing a combined population of approximately 10,944. Located in the Berkshires, Williamstown and Lanesborough are rural in character. The area's principal industries are tourism, education, and medical services. The school population benefits from local resources such as Williams College, the Clark Art Institute, Mass MOCA, Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts, Berkshire Community College and Berkshire Medical Center.

ACADEMICS & COURSE LEVELS

Mount Greylock students individually choose courses through open enrollment, with recommendations and input from teachers, counselors, and family. We offer college preparatory, honors, and Advanced Placement course levels, with the majority of AP courses offered in 11th & 12th grade. While there are no formal policies or limits on AP course enrollment, students are strongly encouraged to take no more than three per year. Due to limited space and scheduling, there are usually more students interested than we are able to accommodate, and courses have enrollment caps with priority given to seniors.

INDEPENDENT, EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING & DUAL ENROLLMENT

11th - 12th grade students who demonstrate readiness for independent work beyond the scope of our offered curriculum may develop, propose, and be approved for an independent study, experiential learning opportunity, or dual enrollment college course. Students may enroll in up to two of these opportunities per semester. Below is a list of courses and grading:

In 2023 - 2024, 7 juniors and 41 seniors took dual enrollment college courses. In Fall 2024, 40% of seniors are enrolled in dual enrollment college courses in the first semester.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS & COURSES

Two-hundred thirty-four (234) credits are required to graduate. Full year courses earn 10 credits; semester courses 5 credits; wellness and health accrue at 3 credits per semester. Students complete their graduation requirements in four years taking 66-70 credits per year.
