Through -out the school, we teach and promote reading, as it is such a crucial skill for children to grasp. Hearing your child read every night will help develop their reading skills and hearing you read to them is also important, no matter the child's age. If you are not doing so already, please try to give at least 10 minutes to this after school or in the evening each day. I know it's not easy, as a parent of three primary school children aged children myself, finding a quiet space and time alone with one child can be a challenge.
