## ☐ Step 1 - Complete athletic registration in the Genesis Parent Access Portal

Highland's Athletic Department uses the Genesis Parent Portal for Athletic Participation Forms. All forms must be completed by a parent or legal guardian prior to each sports season (fall, winter, and spring).

### ☐ Step 2 – Complete all Health Forms

Each student-athlete and indoor percussion participant must turn in an up-to-date Preparticipation Physical Evaluation Medical Eligibility Form to the school nurses' office for review by the school physician before athletic/percussion participation begins per New Jersey state law. All questions about your child's eligibility should be directed to our school nurse.

## ☐ Step 3 - ImPACT Baseline Test

All 9th grade, 11th grade, and transfer students must complete the ImPact Baseline Test. If the student is currently being treated by a doctor for a concussion, do not take the test. Instead, contact the Athletic Trainer or nurse ASAP. All questions concerning the ImPACT test can be directed to the Athletic Training Office at (856) 227-4100 ext 4100.

- ★ Please be aware that completing the registration process and the physician's physical exam does NOT guarantee the student's eligibility to participate. Athletic eligibility is contingent upon:
  - → Completed physical packet paperwork
  - → A valid physical (good for 365 days)
  - → Academic requirements/credits
  - → Behavioral/conduct requirements
  - → No outstanding fees/fines

## **ImPACT**

All athletes, Pep band, and drumline participants must complete the baseline ImPACT testing before being allowed to participate in their activity. ImPACT is a computerized concussion evaluation system that measures verbal and visual memory, processing speed, and reaction time. To most effectively care for participants who have sustained concussions, it is helpful to compare baseline data to post-concussion data so that any deficits can be determined and proper return-to-play decisions can be made.

### **INSTRUCTIONS FOR ATHLETES**

Please understand that you cannot "fail" this test. It is extremely important, however, that you:

- 1. Set aside 30 minutes in a quiet place with NO DISTRACTIONS.
- 2. READ the instructions very carefully. Failure to do this can affect the test results and you may then have to re-take the test.
- 3. If you do not have Internet access at home and are unable to take the test anywhere else, please contact your school's athletic trainer.
