

## WHERE ARE WE WITH THE SCHOOL PROJECT?



### Attend Community Forum #1

#### January 21, 6-8PM, Scarborough Middle School Cafeteria

- Purpose of Community Forum #1:
  - Overview of the Process (and key milestones for community input)
  - How Education has Changed Since Our Schools Were Built
  - What are we Solving For (the key benchmarking elements we will measure each option against)
  - Overview of the Initial Options being evaluated by the SBAC
  - Public Feedback Opportunity on the Initial Options (community feedback directly informs which options move forward to the next step in the process don't miss your chance to shape the future of Scarborough's schools!)

• In March, the SBAC will vote to reduce the list options down to the "preferred options."

#### • When will we know costs for options being considered?

- The SBAC heard loud and clear in last year's community survey: project cost is a major driver for what people will support. Those survey results indicated a supported tax impact that directly influenced the budget set by the SBAC. The SBAC remains committed to selecting a project that stays within that \$70M-\$130M budget range.
- Cost estimates for the initial options are underway now and will be reviewed by the SBAC in the coming weeks.
  - The SBAC will then determine what, if any, adjustments need to be made to the options to ensure they fall within the set budget (or if the cost simply precludes any of the options from moving forward).

#### • How can you stay involved? Important next steps after the forum:

- Community Survey #1 (coming in late January/early February):
  - Following the forum, postcards will be mailed to all residents to invite them to take an online survey to gather early feedback to the initial options.
  - Feedback from this survey will be among many factors that will be taken into account as the SBAC makes decisions about what proposals to move forward to the next stage of the process.
  - Links to the survey will also be made available in the Scarborough Leader, Town Newsletter, and School Department Newsletter.
  - Paper copies will be made available at the Library and Town Hall for those who prefer that format.

The School Building Advisory Committee (SBAC) was formed in February 2024, following the defeat of the Unified School Proposal at the polls in November 2023. This citizen-led group has brought their expertise and interests to the process, alongside elected officials. During the Spring of 2024, members studied school needs and analyzed previous work. In June 2024, the SBAC presented four exploratory concepts they developed to the Town Council and School Board. The work continues with the support of a professional architectural and engineering firm, as well as a robust community feedback process, to assist the group in narrowing down to one proposal by May 2025.

The Scarborough School Building Advisory Committee will rely on community feedback in early 2025 to help them narrow four potential solutions to the district's overcrowded schools to two. Harriman Architects has been collecting data,







## Important Message from Scarborough's Health Services

Influenza-like illnesses (Influenza, RSV, Covid, the "common cold"...) and Norovirus are currently surging in our community. One of our K-2 schools has been in "outbreak" status this week with a total absenteeism above 15%. Many staff and students have reported Norovirus symptoms: **vomiting, diarrhea, intense stomach pains, headaches, fever, and body aches.** Norovirus is extremely contagious. Most people get better within 1 to 3 days but can still be contagious a few days after symptoms stop. For this reason, the CDC has recommended that <u>students with norovirus symptoms stay home for 2 additional days AFTER symptoms have stopped.</u>

We appreciate your diligence when deciding to send your child to school.





## Inclement Weather - School Closures

Although we have had very little snow to date, in Maine we expect snow storms and other types of inclement weather events during winter. In cases of inclement weather, the Scarborough Public Schools will use up to two "traditional" snow days. All of our schools will be closed on these days and students will not be expected to go to school in person or learn remotely. No school meals will be provided on snow days. These two school days will be made up in June if they are used.



If there are more than two days of inclement weather, we will have remote learning days in lieu of a traditional snow day. On remote learning days, students will stay home and will be expected to complete academic assignments. Meals will be provided in advance for remote learning days.

## GoGuardian / Beacon Parent Notification Delayed




Scarborough Public Schools has been using GoGuardian Beacon services as part of our school's broader suicide prevention program. GoGuardian Beacon is monitoring software used on school issued devices. One of its features includes parent/guardian notifications, which provide instant alerts if a student's online activity after school hours raises concerns while using these devices.

Although we had hoped to enable the parent notification feature

this week, we are currently addressing some issues with its implementation. We will notify you as soon as the feature is fully operational.

In the interim, the system will continue to work as it has this year and past school years. If an alert is generated by the GOGuardian Beacon software it will be sent to administrators to follow up on and communication with parents will occur as needed.





