Technology Center of DuPage (TCD)

Technology Center of DuPage is a Career Technical Education (CTE) campus for 24 high schools in DuPage County, IL. TCD offers a roster of intermediate-level elective career programs for high school juniors and seniors. The focus is on college and career readiness through applied academics, workplace skill development, and work based learning experiences, as well as identifying and preparing for the postsecondary education critical for success and advancement in the chosen career pathway. Students enroll in one program at TCD and spend that year in hands-on occupational skill development, workplace skill development, and academic application. Students spend half of each school day at the TCD campus and half at the high school. All students are required to use the bus transportation provided by the school district. Some students who enroll in both their junior and senior year in the same program may earn college credit as well as high school credit. TCD courses are granted 1.50 per semester. Community High School enrolls approximately 70 students per year at TCD.
