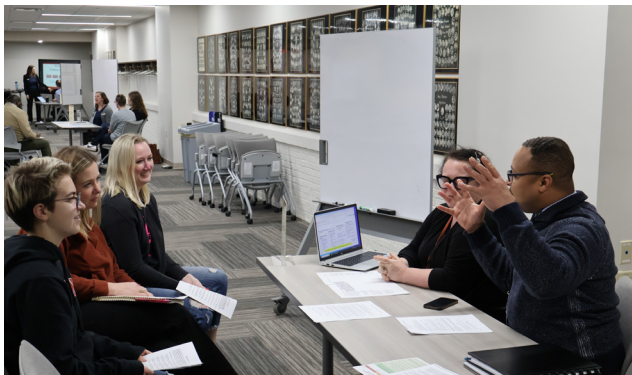

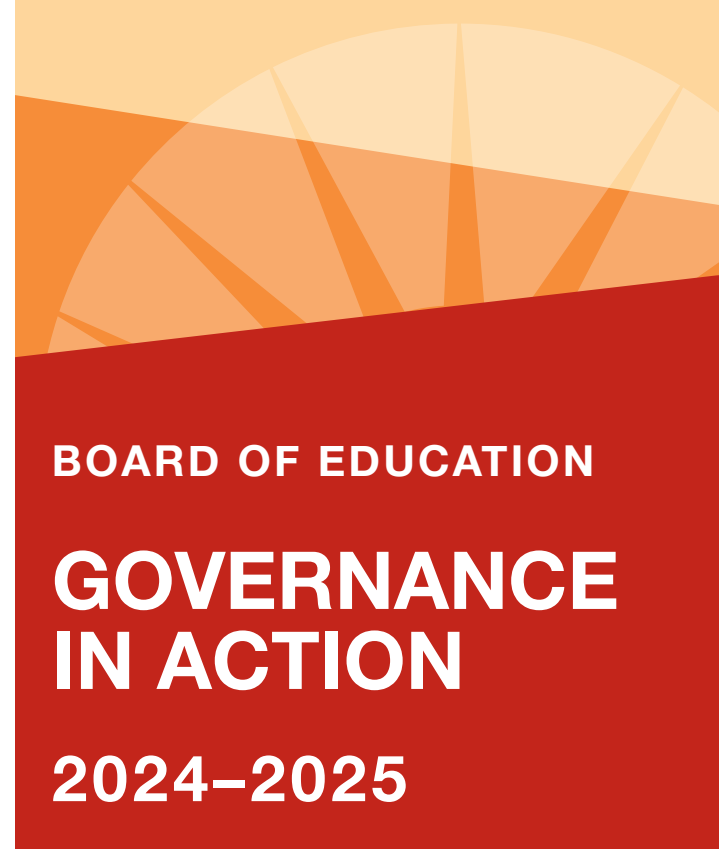

Governance Model Background

The Sun Prairie Area School Board utilizes the “Coherent Governance” model as a framework to clarify their roles and responsibilities, empowering and enabling them to govern well. The model includes Student Results Policies, Operational Results Policies, Operational Expectations Policies, Governance Culture Policies, and Board-Superintendent Relationship Policies to guide them in their role as Board members.

The Board’s job is to represent, lead, and serve the community and to govern the district by establishing expectations for student achievement results, expectations for quality operational performance, and monitoring actual performance against those expectations.



GOVERNANCE CULTURE

The Board will govern lawfully and ethically, as a single unit, focusing primarily on the students of the District, as well as:

- Strategic leadership focused on the future
- Setting a long-term vision and direction for the District
- Encouraging all voices be heard, especially the community whom we serve and represent
- Governance matters rather than administrative issues
- Clear separation of Board and Superintendent roles
- Continuous improvement and professional development
- Building trusting and respectful relationships within the District and throughout the community

Board Purpose: The Sun Prairie Area School District Board of Education is the governing Board of the Sun Prairie Area School District. The Board leads, directs, and supervises the affairs of the District through policy development and accountability to expectations. The Board serves, and is accountable to, the community it represents. The Board holds itself and the Superintendent accountable through continuous monitoring of the expectations and values expressed in the Student Results Policies, Operational Results Policies, Operational Expectations Policies, and Board-Superintendent Relationship Policies.

Board/Superintendent Relations: The Board and superintendent will work together as colleagues as documented in policy to achieve the Student Results.

Community Voices: These sessions consist of a diverse group of future-focused thought leaders that help provide the Board with a broader perspective of community viewpoints. This group engages quarterly in two-way communication about the District’s future.

Monitoring Reports: Each report is an in-depth examination of Student Results Policies, Operational Results Policies, and Operational Expectations Policies to ensure district accountability.

The Sun Prairie Area School District Board of Education is made up of seven elected community members to serve three-year terms. The Board appoints five non-voting student members that each serve a two-year term. All School Board elections are nonpartisan and held in April. The superintendent is appointed by the Board.

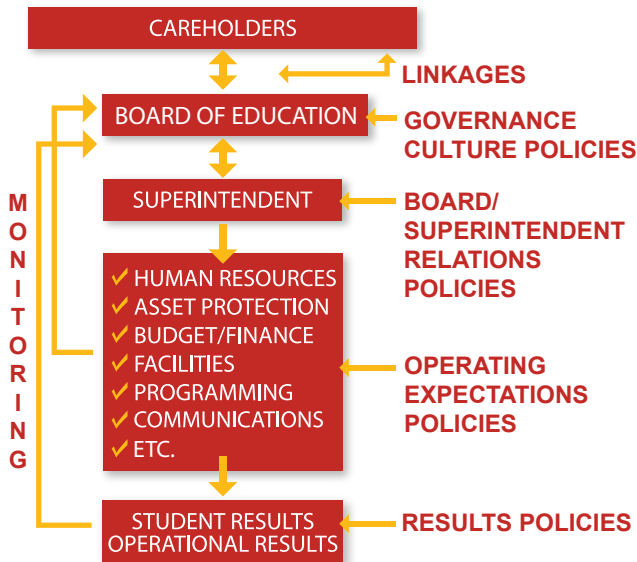
