Attached is a listing of scholarship opportunities in our area that I have been made aware of and/or asked to advertise. This may not be a complete list of every scholarship that exists in our region so be sure to explore churches, employers, and local organizations that could potentially sponsor a scholarship.

I recommend that you spend time within the next week simply reading through this packet and hi-lighting the scholarships for which you would be eligible to apply. Make note of the deadlines since some of these are as early as this month. If no deadline is listed in the description, then it is due April 1.

To organize this packet, I have the scholarships grouped into three different sections. The first section is local scholarships that are available only to Northeast Dubois students. Most of these (10 of the 12) you can apply for by using the **Dubois County Common Scholarship Application**. To access this application go on our school website (www.nedubois.k12.in.us). Then go to schools, jr/sr high school, academics, student services. Then scroll to financial aid and click on the Dubois County Common Application. Download this application and use your pdf editor to fill in the requested information. You can save the completed document in your home drive, which allows you to edit and print the application as needed.

When applying for scholarships, be sure to read the criteria, details, and instructions carefully for each one. They often vary in their purpose and in their requirements. Some may require you to fill out a separate application or include additional attachments. Spend time on the content and context of your essay if one is required. Ask for a letter of recommendation (a month before the deadline) from a teacher who knows you well and/or is in an area related to your major. Request a seventh semester transcript on Parchment for self view in order to print and make copies. Return completed applications into the guidance office by the deadline which is April 1 unless otherwise designated in the scholarship description.

The second section of this packet contains scholarships that also use the **Dubois County Common Scholarship Application**, but these are available to all students in our county. You will follow the same process as you did for the local scholarships. The main difference is that most of these scholarships must be mailed. Please be sure to use the correct postage and mail by the deadline which is April 1 unless otherwise designated.

The last section of this packet contains scholarships that do not use the Dubois County Common Scholarship Application. Each of these has its own application, procedure, and deadline. It will be important to pay attention to where you can access the application online and/or where you can pick up a hard copy.

In addition to applying for the scholarship opportunities in this packet, I recommend these three additional tasks you can do to help pay for college:

1. Apply for FAFSA <https://studentaid.gov>
2. Apply for university-sponsored scholarships at the school you plan to attend
3. Apply for scholarships found using search tools such as fastweb.com and scholarships.com.

Make sure you have all of the required attachments, and **return to the guidance office before the designated deadline (which is April 1 unless noted otherwise).**

- Complete parts A, B, C, D, & Attachment #1 on the Common Scholarship Application.
- Applicants must rank in upper third of class & have taken the SAT or ACT.
- Applicants must enclose a copy of the letter of acceptance from the college they plan to attend and a senior photo.
- Residency of applicants is NOT a consideration.

2. DUBOIS RURITAN DOUBLE YOUR DOLLARS

Applicants must be a dependent of a Dubois Ruritan member.

3. HAYSVILLE RURITAN BUILD YOUR DOLLARS SCHOLARSHIP

- Complete parts A, C, & D of Common Scholarship Application.
- Applicants must be a resident of Haysville (Harbison I Township Voting Precinct).
- Application must be submitted on or before **February 15**.

4. KURT KNIES/RYAN SANDER/LUKE HOWARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

- Complete all parts (except social security is not needed) and include all attachments of the Common Application for these two \$500 Celestine Park sponsored scholarships.
- Applicants must reside in Hall or Marion township.
- For the Luke Howard Memorial, preference will be given to students going into Automotive or Welding career areas.
- Applicants should include a phone number in order to be reached by the committee.

5. BENTON KLUESNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- Complete parts A & D and include all attachments of the Common Scholarship Application.
- One \$1000 scholarship will be given to a Northeast Dubois student.
- Applicants must be involved in FFA and preference will be given to students in golf or a

traveling career-technical program.

6. CELESTINE COMMUNITY CLUB SCHOLARSHIPS

- Children of Celestine Community Club members are eligible to apply.
- Complete all parts and include all attachments of the Common Scholarship Application

7. ARNOLD BROTHERS /ST. PETER'S UCC SCHOLARSHIPS

- Three \$500 scholarships will be awarded to Northeast Dubois students.
- All NDHS seniors pursuing post-secondary education are eligible to apply. Preference will be given to students who are not receiving other scholarship awards.
- Applicants should complete parts A, B, C, D of the Common Scholarship Application, but no attachments are needed and a social security number is not needed.
- Applicant are also asked to write two paragraphs answering the following questions:
 1. How has Christ and your faith shaped your life to this point?
 2. What are your goals and what would you like to achieve in life?

8. LONDON MATTINGLY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- Two \$1000.00 Scholarships will be awarded to two students in the senior class of 2024.
- Complete the Dubois County Common Application and include all attachments.
- Applicants must be involved in FFA or a traveling career-technical program.
- Preference will be given to those who demonstrate financial need.
- Applications will be due April 1.

9. THE AMERICAN LEGION POST #147

Purpose

To assist with secondary education costs

Eligibility

Applicants must be a graduating senior of Northeast Dubois planning to enroll in college in the fall.

Amount of Award

Two \$1000 scholarship will be awarded to a Northeast Dubois student

10. YOUNG MINDS CHANGE LIVES EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

- Students who donate blood at least once during their senior year will be eligible for this American Red Cross Blood Services Scholarship.

- The scholarship amount awarded by the Red Cross to any student(s) from our high school is determined on the number of units collected at our blood drive.
- Turn in the completed Dubois County Common Application to the guidance office by April 1. No attachments needed.

* The following two local scholarships listed below do **NOT** use the Dubois County Common Scholarship Application, but are only available to Northeast Dubois students. Please read details below for instructions on how to apply.

11. **STEVEN M. SEGER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD**

- Four \$2000 scholarships will be available to NDHS students.
- Applicants must earn a varsity award in any two sports during senior year.
- Applications are available in the guidance office in February and are due April 1.
- Recipients will be required to submit a college acceptance letter, as well as a senior photo & resume (which includes names of parents, school & community activities, & career plans/goals) for the Herald write-up.

12. **DEXTER ROYER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

- The Dexter Royer Sports Memorial is a \$500.00 scholarship available to any senior boy or girl that participates in at least two sports. (1-3 scholarships may be awarded per year.)
- There is no application for this scholarship; however, an essay is required.
- Essay Topic: *Research and document five facts about Dexter. Be sure to include both school related and sports related facts and document your source(s) of where you got your information.*
- Please make sure to follow the two simple guidelines listed below. If you don't, your essay will not be accepted.
 1. Place your essay in a sealed envelope. DON'T sign your essay.
 2. Put your first and last name on a small index card and put it in an envelope separate from your essay and seal it.
- All entries must be turned into Mrs. Boeglin. The deadline is April 1.

DUBOIS COUNTY ORGANIZATIONS 2024 - 2025

The following scholarship programs in our county have agreed to use the Dubois County Common Scholarship Application. The majority have the postmark deadline of April 1. *BE SURE TO USE THE CORRECT AMOUNT OF POSTAGE.* When in doubt, check with the post office.

1. REGISTERED NURSE SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsoring Group - Dubois Co. Voiture 813, 40 & 8

Purpose

To assist students who plan to attend college for the purpose of becoming a registered nurse.

Eligibility

Recipient must be a graduate of a high school in Dubois County and must be admitted to a nursing program.

Selection Criteria

Dependents of members will be given first consideration; others will also be considered; all must show evidence of being admitted to a nursing program.

Amount of Award

At the present time - one, two, or three awards of \$500 per year per student. Awards are renewable for a total of up to, but not to exceed 4 years of continuous education.

Presentation of Award

Honors Day

After enrollment, a letter from the Dean of Nursing is required for each semester.

4. **FARBEST FOODS, INC ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP**

Purpose

To assist students pursuing a postsecondary education who have been part of the Mentors for Youth (formerly known as Big Brothers/Big Sisters) program in Dubois County.

Eligibility

Any senior who was a past mentee in the Mentors for Youth Program is eligible for this scholarship. GPA of at least 2.5 and good citizenship at school are criteria to be considered. Students can be attending a college, university, or technical school, in or out of state.

6. CLAUDE AND ALMA LINE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Sponsoring Group – Old National Trust Company

Eligibility

Scholarships are available to students planning to study medical careers **and** for students who are planning to further their education for other careers, including vocational-technical areas.

Amount of award

The amount may vary each year and could be affected by the number of students applying from each local parish. (In 2018 a total of eleven awards were given in the county at \$6000 each)

Procedures for applying

All parts and all attachments of the Dubois County Common Scholarship Application should be completed for the Claude Line Scholarship. Your essay for the third attachment should include why you think you deserve this scholarship. In addition to this, applicants must also include a reference letter from their church stating their affiliation/membership with that church/parish. Also, applicants are required to complete and file FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and submit a copy of their Student Aid Report (SAR) with their application. The SAR is the form received after filing the (FAFSA). It is about a 3-4 page report which assigns you an EFC # (Estimated Family Contribution). Preference will be given to families who do not qualify for state or federal aid.

Submit Application

Students should hand in completed applications to their guidance counselors before April 1. During a selection meeting in early May, merit & character of applicants will be discussed. Scholarship recipients will be announced at Senior Awards Banquets at each of the high schools.

Reference Letter #2: One professional or community involvement reference letter (from current or past employer/supervisor, civic club or local organization) 5. Reference Letter #3: One academic reference letter (from teacher, administrator or coach) 6. College acceptance letter, if applicable: If you're already accepted into college, please provide a letter of verification 7: Applicant Headshot: This is optional, and will not be distributed to the selection committee. Photos will only be used for publication if chosen as a scholarship recipient. By submitting the headshot, you are granting Memorial Hospital Foundation permission to use it to promote your award. Essay Tips: The essay should be 250 words or less, explaining why you have chosen a healthcare vocation and why you are applying for the scholarship. Be creative! The essay is a very important part of your application. Do not use the following phrase (or one like it): "...because I have always wanted to help people..."
