CCMS GIRLS TO PLAY FOR CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP MONDAY NIGHT IN MILAN

The Maddox sisters have had quite a weekend of basketball for Crockett County teams.

Just one evening after her older sister Jordyn scored a career-high 31 points to spark the high school's upset of defendina champion Dyersburg Friday, Jentry Maddox knocked down 26 points to lead the middle schoolers to a 44-28 triumph over Union City in the NWMSAA Tournament. The win was the sixteenth straight for the Lady Cavaliers, who will now face South Gibson for the conference tournament championship Monday night in Milan.

Maddox has now connected for 50 points over her last two games as Coach Jamar Turner's club guns for the league title. Her 26-point performance Saturday included a trio of three-pointers.

The Lady Cavaliers raced to a 14-5 first-quarter advantage as Maddox scored 10, but the halftime edge was only 21-13. Turner's squad came out of the break and threw a lock-down defense at Union City in the third period, holding the Lady Tornadoes to a single point while extending the lead to 30-14.

Ruth Gourley netted all nine of her points in the second half to help Crockett secure the victory. Addie Whitby had five points and Khylee Cobb four to complete the scoring for the winners, who are now 18-3.

Crockett's boys, who gained a semifinal berth with a double-overtime victory Thursday night, were eliminated from the event Saturday night in another overtime thriller, this time won by Milan 28-22.

The 11-11 Cavaliers, coached by Tyler Gadlen, will compete in the James C. Haile Tournament in Murfreesboro, playing in the opening round Monday at 12:45.
