Reason: Principles of Engineering serves as a cornerstone course within our proposed Engineering Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathway. This foundational course is strategically designed to meet both the growing demands of the engineering sector and the educational needs of students pursuing STEM careers. As part of our state-approved CTE pathway, this course aligns with industry standards and provides students with both college preparation and career-ready skills.

HUMANITIES

ADDITION: Rock and Soul of America (Half Year – Semester Course)

Prerequisite: None

Reason: The class will cover issues of race, gender, age, and how Rock and Roll helped to spur rebellion in those areas in an attempt to create equality. Students will explore how Rock and Roll contributed to historical social movements, live civil rights and gender equality.
