The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is now available for students who will be in college during the 2025-26 academic year. Visit <u>fafsa.gov</u> to complete the online financial aid application used by the vast majority of U.S. colleges.

***A few days before completing the FAFSA, both the student and parent will need to set up a Federal Student Aid account username and password (this account is sometimes called a Federal Student Aid ID). Visit <u>here</u> to do so.

SEL Tip of the Week



Need a Change? Breaking negative habits starts with small, intentional choices. First, identify the habit you want to change and understand *why* you do it—what triggers it? Then, replace it with a positive action.

For example, if you scroll on your phone to avoid homework, try setting a timer for 10 minutes of focused work instead. Celebrate any and all steps forward and be patient with yourself—change takes time.

Remember, you're not alone! There are resources at school to help you including counselors, teachers, and peer support groups. Reach out—they can offer strategies and encouragement to help you succeed. You have the power to choose actions that help you grow! Don't stand still for fear of not being able to change.
