

TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

If a student receives school-based testing accommodations, they may be eligible for accommodations for the PSATs, SATs, and AP Exams. It is important for students and families to understand that determination of accommodations for standardized testing is **NOT** made by Unionville. The decision lies with the testing agency, College Board or ACT. Typically, the following materials must accompany the request for accommodations:

- IEP or 504 agreement
- Documentation including psycho-educational evaluation (within 3 - 5 years old)
- Specific Diagnosis
- History
- Tests of cognitive ability and academic achievement
- Specific recommendations based on functional limitations
- Use of testing accommodations in the school setting
- Evaluator's credentials

If one of these pieces is missing from a student's request, they may not be approved for accommodations.

If you currently have an IEP contact your case manager to begin the process of applying for test accommodations. If you currently have a 504, contact your school counselor. Please note that the process can take up to 8 weeks, so plan early!
