OPERATIONAL EXCELLENCE




Stamford Public Schools receives funding from the City of Stamford as well as state, federal, and private grants. The operating budget—which is approved annually by the Boards of Education, Finance and Representatives—funds day-to-day operations. Grants typically fund specific programs, services, or staff positions.

SAFETY & SECURITY

The safety and security of students, staff, and visitors is a top priority for Stamford Public Schools. The SPS Security Department is responsible for emergency management and the implementation of safety and security policies, plans, and training. This department also manages all internal investigations related to student or staff misconduct.

SPS employs 55 building-based school security staff who assist with student and visitor management, securing points of entry, monitoring student behavior, and assessing threats. School security staff are assigned to all PreK-12 building sites.

There are six School Resource Officers (SROs) assigned to Stamford Public Schools. SROs are sworn police officers who have received additional training in school-based law enforcement and crisis response strategies. SROs are employed and supervised by the Stamford Police Department but work full time in our schools.

The security department continues to offer training to all of our staff through a collaboration with the Stamford Police Dept. in areas of Active Assailant Training and Emergency Response.

TECHNOLOGY



The SPS Technology Plan was introduced during the 2023-24 school year. This plan addresses technology use as it supports Curriculum. Instruction and Assessment, Personalized Professional Development, Resources, Budget and Community Partnerships, Data, Privacy and Infrastructure. The plan follows the Future Ready Schools® Frameworks, an industry standard for digital visioning, planning learning, and implementation.

COMMUNICATIONS



STRONG CURRICULUM

Stamford Public School's instructional practices aim to prepare students for success in an ever-changing global society. We move every student forward from where they start, including both high achievers and those struggling academically. Written curriculum, as the most critical tool to support high quality teaching and learning, not only defines high levels of student learning, but also supports teachers with suggestions on how to deliver differentiated, student-centered instruction that is responsive to students' needs, backgrounds, and perspectives.

The 2023-24 school year was year two of a three-year project to develop new or updated curriculum in all content areas across PreK-12. Hundreds of our teachers are contributing to this work by participating in curriculum development committees. As of December 2023, the following content aligns with "Gold Star" curriculum standards:

CAREER PATHWAYS OFFER OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL

SPS continues to expand its Career Pathways Program, which offers students the opportunity to explore multiple academic pathways that align with their skills and passions.

- More than 100 students completed the Introduction to Manufacturing course.
- SPS finalized an agreement with CT State Housatonic for students to earn credits in Benchwork and Blueprint reading beginning in 2024-25.
- Piloted an Introduction to Public Safety pathway in collaboration with the Stamford Police and Fire Departments and Stamford EMS.
- A second cohort of students completed the pre-apprenticeship construction program at Westhill High School.





AITE Named Project Lead the Way Distinguished School

The Academy of Information Technology & Engineering High School (AITE) was named a 2023-24 Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished School for providing students with transformative learning experiences through PLTW Computer Science, Biomedical Science, and Engineering. AITE was just one of seven schools in Connecticut to be recognized as a PLTW Distinguished School.

Expanded Intradistrict Business Offerings

The 2023-24 school year marked an expansion of academic offerings for high school students interested in pursuing business careers. At Westhill, the successful Academy of Finance became an intradistrict program welcoming students from throughout Stamford regardless of their zoned school. At Stamford High, the inaugural cohort of students in the new High School of Business began their studies.





EDUCATORS IN THE SPOTLIGHT



Westhill Science Teachers Wendy Bosco and Sean Otterspoor, were two of 28 high school teachers from across New England who completed the professional development course Teaching the Genome Generation, sponsored by Connecticut-based Jackson Laboratory.

Davenport Ridge Elementary School Principal Michael Pisseri presented at the national STEM conference at the Lyndon B. Johnson Space Center in Houston, TX. Davenport features a special emphasis on STEM, including higher order, thinking, collaboration and problem-solving skills.





The U.S. Department of State and the Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board announced that SPS Anchor teacher and coach, Jessica Bromberg-Alvarado, was selected for the Fulbright Distinguished Award in Teaching Short Term Program. The Fulbright Distinguished Award in Teaching sends expert U.S. educators to support schools in participating countries. Jessica traveled to the Philippines prior to the 2023-24 school year to provide training in Project-Based Learning.

TEACHER & PARAEDUCATOR OF THE YEAR



Congratulations to Stillmeadow Kindergarten teacher Carolyn Tschinkel, who was named the 2024-25 SPS Teacher of the Year. Ms. Tschinkel is a 33-year teaching veteran who describes her job as a "childhood dream come true."



Congratulations to Stark Elementary's Maritza Nunez, the 2024-25 SPS Paraeducator of the Year. Maritza has supported our students as a paraeducator for 23 years and is also the proud parent of SPS graduates.

LEARNING IN THE SPOTLIGHT



Differentiated Learning in early Grades

Scheduling 90-minute literacy instructional blocks in K-2 allows for differentiated, small group instruction from the classroom teacher and stations where students practice applying their newly-acquired skills in reading, writing, listening and discourse.

Encouraging Creative Thinking at Every Grade Level

Our teachers provide fun and engaging opportunities for students to learn new concepts that combine play with education, while promoting teamwork and social skills. SPS manages nearly 20 multi-million-dollar grants that support district-wide in-school and after school enrichment programming.



Hart Magnet School collaborated with Snapology to provide every classroom with an interactive environment in which to explore science, technology, engineering, robotics, art and math using LEGO[®] bricks and other tools to empower their creativity.

The spirit of scientific inquiry was on display at Cloonan Middle School as 8th graders showcased their engineering prowess in the Egg Drop Contest, orchestrated by science teachers Mr. Russo and Mr. Kelly.

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING

- All secondary schools implemented Restorative Practices programs, which focus on strengthening relationships and connections between individuals, both youth and adults, in a school community.
- Every school hosted three or more Social Emotional Learning (SEL) professional development (PD) sessions. Topics included an overview of SEL, integrating SEL into instruction, analyzing data in the Aperture System, and a school attuned approach to SEL.
- SPS completed implementation of the Devereux Student Strength Assessment (DESSA) for grades K-12. Provided at no cost by the Connecticut State Department of Education, DESSA is a suite of research-based SEL screening tools and assessments .

FOOD SECURITY

Free Meals for All Students

Stamford Public Schools participated in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) service option during the 2023-24 school year. Through CEP, all SPS students had access to breakfast and lunch at no charge. CEP is part of the federally funded National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program.

COMMUNITY FOCUSED

Stamford Public Schools collaborates with cultural and educational organizations from across the region to enrich our students' educational experience. In addition, SPS partners with community based organizations, city and state officials, and business leaders to ensure our families have access to available community resources that support educational success for all Stamford children regardless of income, race or circumstance.

GALA, which is a collaboration with the New Haven-based non-profit Discovering Amistad, fosters leadership skills for female students and highlights their future potential. This year, 12 SPS high school students participated in the GALA program.

According to Discovering Amistad, "The program focuses on the history and relevance of the Amistad Uprising of 1839 and the impact and tools of non-violent activism." The program encourages participants to investigate the topics of identity, oppression, privilege and equality and teaches them how to build leadership and teamwork skills.





In recognition of their dedication to sportsmanship and community service, the Stamford High School Athletic Department was awarded the 2022-2023 Michaels Jewelers Cup Award and the Fred Balsamo Sportsmanship Award, from the Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference (CIAC).

COMMUNITY-SUPPORTED LEARNING

Third grade students at Hart Magnet School enjoyed hands-on learning as part of the SPS animal studies unit while visiting The Whittingham Discovery Center in Mill River Park.



Stark Elementary third and fourth graders learned about innovative sustainability programs from Henkel employees. The students learned about recycling, composting and reducing waste in order to keep our planet safe and clean.





The Belltown Fire Department visited Newfield's Kindergartners who enjoyed seeing a fire truck and the "Jaws of Life" equipment. The presenting firefighters included a current Newfield parent and former Newfield students.



Newfield Reading Teacher Marci Marcus and Lenore Fogel, Director of the UJF Reading Partners Program, provided a workshop for the Reading Partner volunteers in our elementary schools. Reading Partners is a program that pairs volunteer reading tutors with children in grades K-3.

CULTURE OF INCLUSION

Stamford Public Schools works collaboratively with its community partners to maximize opportunities available to students and minimize the achievement and opportunity gaps that exist among various student groups.

Stamford Public Schools celebrates the value of multilingualism and recognizes the 265 SPS students who recently qualified for the Seal of Biliteracy. District wide, 187 seniors and 78 juniors were awarded the Seal of Biliteracy during 2023-24, a designation that they can read, write, speak and understand a language in addition to English. This year, students achieved the designation in 22 different languages.





Westhill High School Art Teacher Jada Hansen partnered with the Institute for American Indian Studies (IAIS) to teach studnets how to create pottery in the tradition of Indigenous Peoples. The project exposed students to a method of indigenous pottery-making to help them understand and respect cultural Native practices of Americans.

More than 30 percent of our families speak Spanish at home, so the Human Resources Department collaborated with the Adult & Continuing Education team to offer free Spanish for Educators courses in 2023-24. More than 50 SPS teachers, administrators, and staff completed the course.
