As exciting as sports can be, sometimes there's a night when "nondescript" is the most appropriate adjective.

Such was the case in Troy Tuesday night, when the Crockett County basketball teams took on host Obion County in a district twin bill. The girls game was basically over after the Lady Cavaliers raced to an 8-0 lead in the first few minutes, and the boys game was bereft of drama after Obion's Rebels scored the first 14 points of the nightcap.

Crockett's girls won 48-26; the Cavalier boys lost 72-49. Both games will be easily forgotten in time.

That's not to say there weren't bright spots. One especially encouraging sign for the Lady Cavs was that sophomore point guard Gabby Bursey buried a trio of three-pointers and made her last six free throws to be Crockett's leading scorer with 15 points. The boys received some good minutes from reserve Cortland Reddick when they briefly staged a second-half comeback, also buoyed by three treys from Zay Jones in the fourth quarter.

But the girls were never seriously threatened, and the guys never came closer than 12 points after the initial Obion run to open the game.

Coach Kayla Irvin's Lady Cavs, now 15-4 on the season, picked up their second district win by holding the Lady Rebels to an 11-point first half, the same limit they hung on Dyersburg last Friday night. While the Crockett offense wasn't cooking as well Tuesday as it was against the Lady Trojans, it still produced enough firepower to maintain a steadily growing margin throughout the night, especially with the defense holding Obion to single digits in all four quarters.

While the lead was only 11 (22-11) at halftime, Bursey scored 13 of her 15 points after the intermission and her teammates produced balanced support as Jordyn Maddox netted nine, Amaria Walker eight, and Karlee Castellaw seven. Keeton Holyfield added four, freshman Wesley Thornton nailed her first career three-pointer, and Halle Holyfield had two tallies to close out the scorebook. Kelvia Campbell led Obion with 14 and Emeri Lee contributed five.

In the boys contest, a lackluster defensive performance in the opening period doomed Crockett. Coach Rick Rudesill yanked his starters at the 2:41 mark of the opening frame after they had fallen behind 17-2 by allowing several easy penetration baskets.

While the second unit performed a little better, the Cavs still trailed 35-12 at the break. A 22-point third period brought the visitors back within shouting distance, with a much stronger defensive effort keying the comeback. By the 4:52 mark of the final stanza, a Cade Freeman triple brought Crockett within 58-46. However, despite the late flurry by Jones, they'd get no closer.

Freeman topped the Cav scoring with 14 points, one more than Jones. But no one else had more than six, while Obion's starting lineup threw an amazingly balanced attack the Crockett. All five finished in double figures: Aiden McBride had 15, Aiden Lee 14, Grady Wilkins and Jetlynn Mosley 13 apiece, and Tanner Richard 10. The Cavs fell to 6-13 with the defeat and have dropped all three of their district games.

Both Crockett teams go non-district Thursday night when they will host Milan for the annual basketball Homecoming festivities
