# PROCESS FOR HONORS & AP QUALIFICATION AND PLACEMENT

## **Qualifying for Honors**

Review prerequisites and submit an ontime Google registration form for the Honors Move-up Test

Take (and pass) move-up test. Study topics list is published mid-winter.

Move-up outcome shared during 1:1 Registration meeting with counselor.

Did not pass move-up? Option to submit an "Honors Placement Waiver" (limit of 2 total in grades 10-12).

\*10-12 waivers cannot be used on AP courses, and cannot be used twice within the same academic department. Waivers will be limited by space available.

### **Qualifying for AP**

Review prerequisites and submit an on-time Google AP Application.

Qualified applicants are accepted automatically. Applicants not fully meeting prerequisites go on a waitlist.

Building schedule is built in March. Course offerings & section numbers are driven by qualified student requests.

Waitlisted AP applicants submit an on-time "Continued Interest" Google form in late spring.

Limited open seats in AP classes are assigned by administration, with consideration for continued interest form details and S2 academic performance.

\*Due to College Board-dictated curriculum requirements and space limitations, there will be no waivers for AP courses.
