Project SEARCH is an international program model empowering young adults with disabilities to make a successful transition from school to adult life. Participants will learn relevant, marketable professional skills.

This unpaid internship is one school year in length and takes place entirely within the host business. The total workplace immersion facilitates the teaching and learning process through continuous feedback and the acquisition of employability and competitive work skills.

The goal for each intern upon completion of the program is competitive employment within the community.

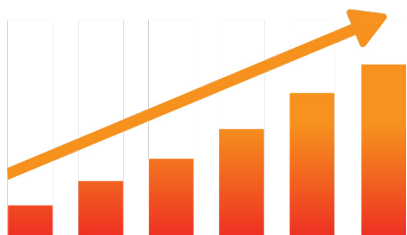

PROJECT SEARCH A FASTER WAY » FORWARD



Our employment rate averages over 70% each program year, which is significantly higher than the Arizona rate of 4.9% of individuals with disabilities working in integrated employment.

(The Power of Disability Employment: The Impact to Arizona's Economy, October 2019)

In a more recent report, individuals specifically served under our state Division of Developmental Disabilities are employed at a rate of 22%.

YOUR NEXT STEPS

1. Project SEARCH applications are open from Mid-October through end of July annually.*
2. If interested in applying, visit website to learn more: west-mec.edu/project-search/
3. To apply immediately go to: focus.west-mec.edu/focus/apply/
4. After you apply, interviews will take place and you will be notified if you are selected.
5. If selected you will receive enrollment information.
6. Enrollment process will include mandatory meetings to ensure a successful transition into Project SEARCH.

* Vocational Rehabilitation funding support may be available to qualified individuals. Please note the eligibility process may take several months.
