- Practice SAT scores are never released to colleges
 Diagnostic tool used to prepare for the SAT

SAT & ACT Timeline & Preparation Fall 9/10/11th Grade – Take PSAT Spring 11th Grade – Take SAT and/or ACT Fall 12th Grade – Retest SAT/ACT as needed

If your child is considering playing intercollegiate sports, they should register with the NCAA Eligibility Center (no later than Fall of Senior year).


