MISSION STATEMENT

At Our Lady of Good Counsel, a Catholic high school sponsored by the Xaverian Brothers, we inspire our students to excel, serve, and love.

THE OPPORTUNITY

Our Lady of Good Counsel High School is searching for its next Principal, who will begin in July 2025. The Principal is the school's Chief Academic & Program Officer appointed by the President and reports to the President. Responsible for all educational programs and outcomes, the Principal provides faculty support and supervision and directs all student, faculty, and parent programs. The Principal is the instructional leader responsible for developing, modeling, and communicating a strong, mission-focused school culture. Additionally, will be a community builder, strengthening the partnerships between faculty, students, and parents. This role manages Good Counsel's educational, artistic, and athletic programs while supporting the school's overall faith formation, business operations, communications and public relations, enrollment, alumni relations, and fundraising efforts. The Principal is part of the President's leadership team consisting of the Chief Advancement Officer, Chief Communications and Enrollment Management Officer, Chief Financial Officer, and Chief Mission and Identity Officer.







SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Our Lady of Good Counsel High School is a co-educational Catholic high school in Maryland, located between Baltimore and Washington, D.C. Good Counsel is dedicated to academic excellence, character development, and a commitment to preparing students for lifelong success by providing a college preparatory education rooted in the Catholic, Christian values of the Xaverian Brothers.

Serving the greater Washington metropolitan area for more than 60 years, Good Counsel was founded in 1958 by the Xaverian Brothers as a Catholic high school for boys in Wheaton, MD. After thirty years, the school became co-educational in 1988 and continued to serve an expanding student body. Over the decades at the Wheaton campus, enrollment continued to grow, as did the need for a larger, more modern facility. In 2007, the school relocated to its current 51-acre campus in Olney, MD.

Today, with an enrollment of 1,300 students, Good Counsel is a highly visible and sought-after Catholic and Independent high school locally and regionally. The diverse student body is evenly split by gender with 55% students of color, and 21 international students. About 50% of students are Catholic and students attend from multiple counties, including Montgomery, Prince George's, and Howard Counties. The school has 101 exceptional faculty members with 85% holding advanced degrees. For the 2024-25 school year, domestic tuition is set at \$30,995 with approximately 45% of students receiving tuition assistance.

Good Counsel is a vibrant, diverse, and inclusive Catholic community that inspires students to excel, serve, and love. "In harmony, small things grow" is the motto of the Xaverian Brothers, and at Good Counsel students not only grow but flourish. In our dynamic community parents and students form enduring personal relationships with each other—and with their teachers, coaches, and advisors. Relationships formed here deepen the sense of belonging that our graduates and families carry with them well beyond their days at Good Counsel.

The school is fully accredited by the State of Maryland and dually accredited by the Association of Independent Maryland and DC Schools (AIMS) and the Middle States Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. Good Counsel has twice been named a "Blue Ribbon School of Excellence" by the U.S. Department of Education. It is a member of the College Entrance Examination Board, the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA), and the National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC).

EXCEPTIONAL ACADEMICS

As a Catholic school, Our Lady of Good Counsel High School's academic programs are based upon and inspired by the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church. Every effort is made to foster a spirit and sense of community supported by a belief in the dignity and uniqueness of everyone.

The Good Counsel curriculum is defined, yet flexible; students can choose a path that allows them to focus on a certain field of study or explore a host of subjects, all while benefiting from a college preparatory program. Teachers personalize the educational process and work with students at all levels of development to support each student. Students challenge themselves in the classroom and explore subjects of personal curiosity in courses such as Aerospace Engineering, America at the Crossroads, Latin, Bioethics, and Theater Production.

Good Counsel students find success in the school's Advanced Placement courses and International Baccalaureate Diploma program. For highly motivated students with diagnosed mild learning disabilities, the Ryken Program offers a structured, small-group learning environment. The STEM program is nationally recognized and introduces up to 40 students each year to engineering with its hands-on, project-based curriculum called Project Lead the Way. Good Counsel has been recognized as a "Distinguished Project Lead the Way School," a distinction earned by only 2% of qualified schools nationally. The 1:1 iPad program bridges a gap between the computer technology available in school and out of school. Our students develop an appreciation for the deep learning that results when technology is used effectively as part of their formal education.

With a 100% reported college matriculation, students leave Good Counsel prepared to succeed in the world.



AWARD-WINNING ARTS

Good Counsel offers an outlet for every artist to emerge. With programs in choral music, instrumental music, visual arts, dance, and theater, Good Counsel has an outlet for every student to discover their artistic side. The school brings students into contact with professional artists from each discipline in a variety of ways, including workshops, mentorships, and community-based relationships that connect to the world outside the classroom.

The school offers choral and instrumental music programs; dance classes in agility, balance, and strength; classical dance techniques; jazz dance and modern dance; theater courses that allow students to explore the depths of their talents in acting, directing, playwriting, and aspects of theater design; and visual arts courses in art fundamentals, ceramics, drawing & painting, and AP Studio Art. In addition, Good Counsel has the only marching band in the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference with over 50 participants.

Good Counsel graduates have performed on Broadway and the big screen in award-winning movies like The Color Purple. They have received Emmys for artistic and technical achievements. They are brilliant jazz musicians, accomplished writers, and beloved comedians. Their notable talents shine bright and provide a source of pride for all Falcons.

REGIONALLY AND NATIONALLY RANKED ATHLETICS

Good Counsel's top-ranked athletics program allows student-athletes to pursue their sports at a competitive level. Nationally recognized as a premier athletics program, Good Counsel holds 75+ Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC) titles from the past decade alone. The 775 students who join the Good Counsel Athletics' 40+ programs learn self-respect, self-discipline, and self-esteem. Most importantly, they understand themselves better as they strive to live the Xaverian values on and off the field.

Good Counsel graduates have won at the Penn Relays, played at the highest level of Division I athletics, and traveled throughout the country to compete. They've even won gold in the Olympics, played in the NFL, and competed on the U.S. Women's National Soccer Team. Their efforts bring honor to our school and earn the respect and admiration of their opponents.



ROBUST SCHOOL LIFE

Good Counsel's welcoming and enriching community extends beyond the classroom, the stage, and the playing fields. The vibrant student life is evident in a range of cultural, academic, spiritual, and social clubs available for students. With retreats, mission trips, and service opportunities, Good Counsel students have countless opportunities to grow and experience the school's values. The Office of Mission and Identity is an important part of student life and integrates Good Counsel's Catholic and Xaverian mission and identity into day-to-day life.

Good Counsel offers students extracurricular and co-curricular activities through the club program. The goals of the club program are to foster students' exploration of their areas of interest and to build social and leadership skills. Under the guidance of faculty advisers, students can choose from more than 50 different clubs, from robotics to cooking to service, and affinity groups, and they also have the opportunity to create a new club or group if there is interest. Students are encouraged to participate in at least one activity each year. Like our athletics and arts, students perform at a high level; the Speech and Debate club has earned 17 consecutive Metro Titles.

MODERN STATE-OF-THE-ART CAMPUS

Good Counsel is located in Olney, MD. The campus is home to exceptional academic, arts, worship, and athletic facilities constructed in 2007. This includes 12 science and technology labs; a 150-seat chapel; a 650+ seat state-of-the-art Performing Arts Center (2016) including a dance studio; a library and new teaching and learning center; two indoor gyms; a turf field; a running track; a baseball stadium with batting cages; five practice fields; two weight rooms; and a comprehensive athletic training room. Good Counsel will conduct a campaign planning study this fall with possible priorities, including a STEM Center, an Athletic and Wellness Center, and continuing to build the endowment.









OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

With Good Counsel's vibrant school community, successful and high-achieving academic programs, and strong enrollment, many opportunities are present for Good Counsel's continued advancement as a highly sought-after school for families and students throughout the region. Good Counsel is committed to providing every student access to best practices in 21st-century teaching and learning, supported by an innovative curriculum, rigorous college preparatory programs, and comprehensive student services. In the near term, the Principal, through leading, managing, and working with the assistant principals and program directors, will:

- Strengthen faculty & staff formation as educators in a Catholic, Xaverian Brothers Sponsored School.
- Further advance and strengthen the school culture.
- Ensure that academic programs capitalize on school strengths and meet the evolving needs of students and families. The next Principal will be called upon to strategically discern, in collaboration with other school leaders, which programs to capitalize on and advance.
- Ensure that students who are not in specialized academic programs have rigorous curriculum and instruction leading to AP and/or IB coursework.
- Develop a comprehensive, multi-leveled faculty professional development program.
- Apply IB approaches and philosophy in teaching and learning across all grade levels and courses.
- Enhance the educational technology program for students and faculty. Strategically discern, with other school leaders, how to remain at the forefront of educational technology and AI.
- Further integrate student support programming to cultivate student belonging and well-being.
- Broaden college counseling access and advising.
- Work closely with other school leaders to carry out strategic plan activities
 to ensure the academic vision is well-articulated and effectively executed
 with the faculty and staff.
- Work in collaboration with the President and the leadership team to support a fundraising campaign to advance Good Counsel's future.

ABOUT THE OLNEY, MARYLAND AREA

Olney, Maryland is located between two major urban areas; about 15 miles north of Washington, DC, and 30 miles south of Baltimore. With a current population of 35,820, Olney was largely agricultural until the 1960s, when the growth of the District of Columbia's suburbs led to its conversion into a mostly residential area. Today, Olney is a vibrant and family-friendly community that is home to more than 250 local businesses. Living in Olney offers residents a sparse suburban feel, and most residents own their homes.

Founded in 1958 and located directly across the street from Good Counsel, the Olney Theatre Center is one of two state theaters in Maryland. It presents professional-level dramatic and musical live theatrical productions in its large and modern playhouse on the east edge of town, drawing audiences from across the Washington metropolitan area. The community is also home to an October Community Night that takes place on the Good Counsel campus and a large community festival in April, known as "Olney Days." The event includes a parade, charity bike ride and walk, and movie night. Olney has more than a dozen houses of worship of multiple faiths, including Catholic, Episcopalian, Methodist, Jewish, Seventh-Day Adventist, Baptist, and Latter-Day Saints.
