



# Game on the Go



## Eye Spy

The player gives the first letter, color or size of the object they see as a clue. For example if the player chooses a banana, they might say "I spy with my little eye something beginning with a B" or "I spy with my little eye something yellow." If they spy a bike, they might say "I spy with my little eye something with wheels." Players take turns to call out guesses until someone gets the answer. The first person to guess correctly gets to choose the next object.

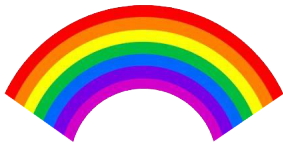


## Search and Find Games

Search and Find Games are a great way to pass time, have fun and build skills. These games can help pass the time in the car, while waiting in line, at a restaurant or for an appointment.

### Rainbow Search

Try to find objects for each color of the rainbow



### Shape Finder

See how many circles, squares, triangles and other shapes you can find.



### Sign Spotter

How many different signs can you find around you, such as stop signs and restroom signs?



## Yes or No

One person (Adult or child) tells the other player "I am thinking of an animal". The second player tries to guess what animal it is by asking questions that can only be answered with "yes" or "no." For example "Is the animal big?" "Does the animal have fur?"

## Am I Bigger Than?

While taking a walk with your child, have him/her look for things that are bigger or smaller than he/she is. Show your child things that are taller than they are but smaller than you are. Then, show them how trees are taller than both of you.
