




About The Teacher







TWIG curriculum takes students on a journey from their senses all the way to space! Connects the social and emotional development of TK students with hands on investigations, songs, movement, and read alouds.





TK children go to Music class two to three times per week. They learn songs, dances and fingerplays. TK children participate in our annual Winter Celebration Concert.





Physical Education with "Mr. C"

Transitional Kindergarteners have Physical Education for 30 minutes, every other day.

We cover many areas of physical skills including:

- Locomotor movements
- Large group games
- Obstacle courses
- Motor Planning
- Fitness
- Sportsmanship











STEAM with Ms. Richard

Transitional Kindergarteners attend STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) classes weekly for 40 minutes.

- Students have frequent hands-on activities
- Creativity and collaboration will be encouraged as students solve problems.
- Students will be exposed to a variety of STEAM concepts like the engineering design process and problem solving that will maximize critical thinking, innovation, productive struggle and collaboration.






LIBRARY with Mrs. Baxter

Transitional Kindergarteners attend Library once a week for 30 minutes with their class.

Class visits feature storytime with Mrs. Baxter, time to explore books, and book checkout.

Transitional Kindergarteners check out 1 book at a time. They take home this book every week and bring it back in order to check out a new one.





Mrs. Baxter uses Library Time to connect with each student, teach through storytelling, and instill a lifelong love of the library.

Portola Valley Schools Foundation



Portola Valley Schools Foundation is a non-profit volunteer organization that raises funds to support to the Portola Valley School District. Our purpose is to close the gap between what public education funding pays for, and the high-quality education we desire for our children.

The Foundation typically contributes between 5% and 7% of the District's annual \$15 million budget, supporting low student/teacher ratios, classroom aides, reading specialists, physical education, science, music, art programs and more.

Our biggest fundraising effort occurs every year in the fall, with our **Annual Campaign**. The campaign asks our community of parents, neighbors and local businesses to make donations to support our wonderful schools. We raise over **\$1 million annually** and the funds go to the district General Fund.
