About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

The school has distinct policies regarding bullying and harassment, as listed in the SCFS Board Policy notebook. Students should feel safe at any school, and we encourage students to be supportive of each other. However, if a situation arises where either bullying or harassment occurs, the staff will take it seriously and investigate and intervene, if necessary. The school promotes safety through locked doors, exterior cameras, and one-way windows to protect students and staff. Our school has a history of families and students attending our school who support a caring and loving environment.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Since our students are on campus only way day per week, the school has to be flexible with its extra-curricular activities. The activities fall into two categories: Enrichment which the school provides such as outdoor hikes, beach clean-ups, trips to various sites, including theater productions. All of this, of course, is dependent upon state regulations due to the pandemic. Clubs at the school, including the chess club, is available at this time. Other clubs will be added as the year progresses, dependent on the state regulations. Safety, of course, is our primary concern.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Parents play an integral part of the way South Columbia Family School functions. Parents, who are choosing to home-based their children's schooling, are always a critical part of our school. The families, in normal times, interact with other families in both educational settings and socialization activities. Some parents have provided enrichment activities such as art, yoga, and outdoor activities. Our PTO has earned money for various activities, including a delayed trip to OMSI for our middle school students. Our teachers meet with the individual families weekly or bi-weekly, based upon need.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

South Columbia Family School is a charter school with students from throughout Columbia County, but including students from Washington County and Multnomah County. The school has, in the past, had Board members from throughout the county, representing businesses, education, and families. We have worked closely with various organizations, and most recently with the County Health Department to provide a safe environment for our students. This year, we will be doing some fundraising for some non-profits in our County. We have, also, had various groups from our county and other counties present to our students.
