WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Seaford Union Free School District desires to embark upon the following repairs at the District's facilities: District-wide security camera upgrades and door ajar system; toilet room renovations at Harbor Elementary School; asphalt replacement at Harbor Elementary School; sound and press box upgrades at Seaford High School football stadium; cafeteria renovation at Seaford High School; auditorium renovations at Seaford High School; District-wide ceiling replacement; District-wide floor replacement; District-wide door replacement; audio visual upgrades at Manor Elementary School; sitework renovations at Manor Elementary School; sitework renovations at Seaford Middle School; playground turf renovations at Manor Elementary School; weight room renovations at Seaford Middle School; Maintenance garage overhang replacement, all of the foregoing to include all labor, materials, equipment, apparatus and incidental costs related thereto (hereinafter the "Projects"); and

WHEREAS, said repair is subject to classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

**WHEREAS** maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility are classified as Type II Actions under the current Department of Environmental Conservation SEQRA Regulations (Section 6 NYCRR 617.5 (c)(1)); and

WHEREAS, replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or a facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building or fire codes, unless such action meets or exceeds any of the thresholds in section 617.4 are classified as Type II Actions under the current Department of Environmental Conservation SEQRA Regulations (Section 6 NYCRR 617.5 (c)(2)); and

**WHEREAS**, routine activities of educational institutions, including expansion of existing facilities by less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area and school closings, but not changes in use related to such closings (Section 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(10));

**WHEREAS** the SEQRA Regulations declare Type II Actions to be actions that have no significant impact on the environment and require no further review under SEQRA; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Education, as the only involved agency, has examined all information related to the repairs and has determined that the Projects are classified as Type II Actions pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(1), (2) and (10) of the SEQR Regulations.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education hereby declares itself lead agency in connection with the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Education hereby declares that the Projects are Type II Actions, which require no further review under SEQRA; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education hereby shall forward an official copy of this Resolution to the New York State Education Department together with a copy of the correspondence from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation in connection with its request for approval of the listed project from the New York State Education Department.
