Important Update: 6th Grade Schedule Changes Starting Monday, 1/28/2025

There will be a slight adjustment to the 6th-grade schedule that will begin on Monday, January 28, 2025, during Session 3 Monday-Thursday.

Instead of the current schedule where students split their time equally between math and science, they will now alternate between the two subjects. Students will spend the entire 92-minute session with one subject at a time, attending each class twice a week (Mon/Wed or Tues/Thurs).

This change is designed to better prepare students for their 7th-grade schedule and provide more time for engaging, hands-on science labs planned for this semester. Additionally, we aim to apply the same scheduling format to English Language Arts (ELA) and social studies during the last nine weeks of this semester.

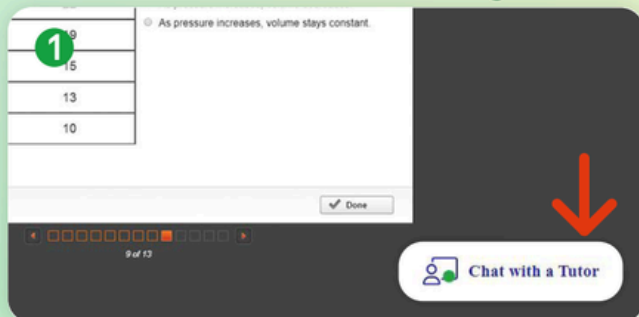

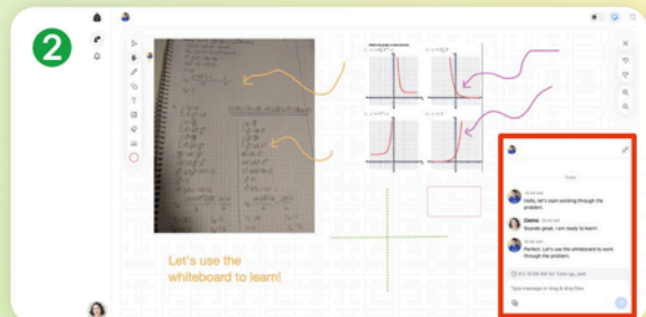

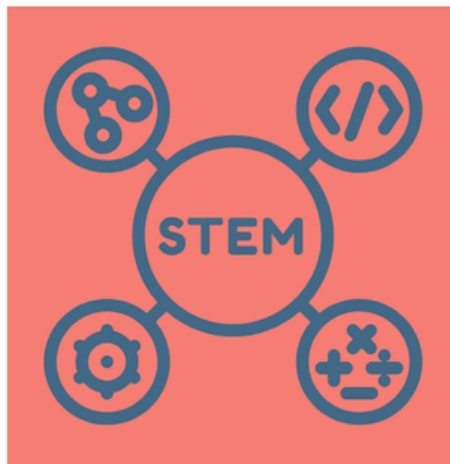

New Mexico Coalition of Educational Leaders 2025 Scholarship Award Criteria

The New Mexico Coalition of Educational Leaders will award five scholarships in the amount of \$2,000.00 to New Mexico high school seniors who will be entering a college or university.

CRITERIA FOR APPLICATION AND SELECTION CANDIDATES

1. Candidate must be a graduating senior from any public high school in the state of New Mexico.
2. Candidates must have a G.P.A. of 3.0 or better for consideration.
3. **Preference** will be given to those entering the field of education (Teacher, Counselor, Social Worker, School Business Official, etc.).
4. Interviews with each of the top 7-10 candidates will be conducted by the Selection Committee in May.

APPLICATION PROCESS: Submit the following completed documents:

1. The Scholarship Application Form (signed by High School Official and Principal)
2. Two letters of recommendation from teachers/and or school administrators.
3. A typed 300–400-word essay outlining the candidate's reasons for entering the field of education or another career field.
4. Official High School Transcript
5. A Scanned Application Packet of documents should be sent to:
