### OVERVIEW:

Eastwood Local is a rural district with students from the villages of Luckey and Pemberville and the townships of Webster, Troy, Freedom, Middleton, Center, Perrysburg and Montgomery. EHS is located 25 miles southeast of Toledo and 12 miles east of Bowling Green.

The Class of 2025 consists of 110 students with an anticipated graduation rate of 98 percent. Approximately 55-60 percent of the class is expected to enroll in college (four-year: 45-50%, two-year: 10%) while about 25 percent is completing an industry-credential through Penta Career Center (career-tech). The remaining 15 percent will either join the Armed Forces or the workforce immediately following graduation.

Eastwood's first graduation following consolidation took place in 1959. Our campus is located on Sugar Ridge Road in Pemberville and features three buildings (elementary, middle school, high school), all on one conveniently located corner.

### CURRICULUM:

EHS offers honors, college prep and College Credit Plus (CCP) courses through the University of Findlay (UF) and Bowling Green State University (BGSU) in addition to general classes. Students who wish to pursue a career-technical program are encouraged to attend Penta Career Center.

### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

Students must earn a minimum of 21.5 credits within the required areas (below). They must also pass state tests in Algebra I, English II, earn an Ohio State Seal, and all Eastwood students must complete 16+ hours of volunteer service.

### CLASS RANK & WEIGHTED GRADES:

Class rank is computed each semester, is cumulative and is reported on our transcripts. Eastwood does NOT recognize a Valedictorian or Salutatorian.

Starting in the 2024-25 school year, Eastwood eliminated all weighted grades and took everything to a 4.00 scale. In order to accommodate our students in honors courses, we extended the range of an A to 87-100%.

For several years going forward students who earned weighted grades prior to the policy change may have a GPA in excess of 4.0, however, each class will see less and less of this.
