First Day Exclusion

Current U-46 Board Policy 7.100

- If the examination is not completed by the opening of school, exclusion will take place immediately.
- If students are initially enrolling in the District and prior compliance has not been met, a two-week grace period will be authorized before such evidence will be required.
- New students who register after <u>October 15</u> shall have 30 days following registration to comply with the regulation.

ISBE

If a child does not submit proof of having had either the health examination or the immunization as required, then the child shall be examined or receive the immunization, as the case may be, and present proof by October 15 of the current school year, or by an earlier date of the current school year established by a school district.105ILCS 5/27-8.1.

ISBE Continued

Any school district that, for two years in a row and in any combination, either fails to deliver its report to the State Superintendent of Education by November 15 or delivers a report that does not comply with the percentage requirements of Section 27-8.1 of the School Code shall be issued a Notice of Non-Compliance. Unless, within seven school days after the mailing of the notice, the district presents written evidence to the State Superintendent that it has delivered the report required by Section 27-8.1 and the report complies with the percentage requirements of that Section, the State Superintendent shall reduce by 10 percent each subsequent payment to the district of General State Aid funds under Section 18-8.05 of the School Code, provided that all amounts withheld shall be restored to the district after compliance is documented. The reduction in the district's General State Aid payments shall commence on January 1 and shall occur semimonthly thereafter, provided that all amounts withheld shall be restored to the district after compliance is documented.
