

Purpose

- Propose to the Board of Education the adoption of the four curriculum frameworks for high school physical education.
 - > Lifeguard Certification and Leadership
 - > Introduction to Leadership in Physical Education
 - > Advanced Leadership in Physical Education
 - > Senior Leadership Practicum in Physical Education
- > Provide common district wide learning opportunities and assessments for students that are in compliance with the new Illinois Learning Standards.
- Implement physical education courses that provide students skills, knowledge, experiences and certifications to be used within career pathways.

We have developed, will implement and will support a challenging, standards based physical education curriculum that focuses on individual leadership skills and opportunities for students to use their skills in leadership roles within our schools and community.

We have developed a professional development plan to support teacher training, collaboration and certifications to successfully implement these four courses at all U46 high schools.

Rationale

- New lifeguard certification course that will provide students with career opportunities in the community and physical education classes.
- Development of district wide standards based curriculums with assessments and rubrics aligned to the updated State and National Learning Standards.
- Alignment of physical education courses with the career pathways vision.

Beliefs/Research

- Physical education needs to provide relevant options for students to learn and demonstrate what they know in a variety of activities.
- Physical education needs to connect what students know and can do with their health and career opportunities.
