






Overall parent response rate	20.7%	41.0%









FDK Family Survey Results




FDK Family Survey: School Climate




FDK Survey Results: Family Engagement




FDK Family Survey: Free Response Questions


What is the biggest obstacle that prevents you from getting more involved at your child's school?
