History of the Program

SROs in U-46:

- High schools since the 1980's
- Middle schools since the 1990's
- In 2006, the District hired a Safety Coordinator, aligning this District resource
- Information sharing agreements with law enforcement began in 2008
- Cost sharing shifted in 2009 from 75-100% daily District cost to be approximately 55-60% District / 35-40% Police
- Bi-monthly meetings for coordination and consistency

SRO Structure:

- Annual contract renewals with the four police departments started in 2008
- U-46 job description from the contract
- Police department has supervision responsibility
- SRO reports to the Principal/Director of School Safety and Culture
- SRO in each middle school, high school
- Dream Academy and Central Schools Program share a full-time SRO
- Shared interview process police department announces the position, officers apply, those applicants are interviewed by a team of police, as well as school and district administration
- Each police department assigned a police Sergeant to liaison with the District's Director of Safety and Culture in collaboration and oversight

SRO Activities:

- Early on, SROs were involved in discipline; we shifted that by contract and in the job description about 6 years ago
- SROs do not enforce discipline
- SROs help manage street gang issues and are aware of activities on the streets in their communities
- Experts in security plans and event management
- Assist with critical events
- Mentoring and relationship building
- Teaching classes
- Present when school administration conducts random weapons or drug searches
- Mediators, restorative practices, and home visits

SRO Training:

Although not formalized by agreement in the past, training has included:


- Illinois Certified Juvenile Officer

The 2021 SRO contracts will recommend a change that requires adherence to the Illinois Training Standards Board.




Arrests by Ethnicity 2013-14 to 2019-20




Students arrested by Age Overall 2014-2019

- Expanding mentoring with students
- See something, say something violence prevention programs with students
- Student-led violence prevention programs/safety programs
- Continue to assist with our threat assessment and threat prevention
- A.L.I.C.E. (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) active shooter response training for school staff
- Handle with Care program trauma informed care
