How to Guide Students through the History, Philosophy & Religious Studies Department's Offerings

Required Courses

- one full credit of **World History**, to be earned in the freshman or sophomore year.
- one full credit of United States history, to be earned in either the junior or senior year. (The department strongly recommends that students earn this credit in their junior year. Students may petition the Department Chair, in consultation with the Director of Studies, to delay taking U.S. history until their senior year.) This may be fulfilled with either of the following:

CL United States History (with permission of the department)

* two courses for the philosophy, psychology, and religious studies diploma requirement. *At least one* of these courses must be from philosophy and religious studies, and at least one must be taken during the junior or senior year.
