 - Provides teacher access to an assessment series including three benchmark assessments
 - Administrator Digital dashboard
 - Canvas integration
 - Professional Development

Process

- Training will be provided on DCD and PPD days.
- Fall 2023 Standards-based instructional design using the tools in the app; work and planning time for teachers as they design their lessons with learning targets, strategies using *CommonLit* and formative and summative assessments.
- Onboarding training for new teachers each year.
