
# U-46 COVID CONSIDERATIONS FOR 2022-2023

BASED ON CDC OPERATIONAL GUIDE AS RECOMMENDED BY IDPH



## **VACCINATIONS:**

### Staff

- 3rd dose for 16 and up
- 4th dose 50 and up

Employee Group	Fully Vaccinated	Unvaccinated
Admin/Non-Union	87%	13%
DUEA	89%	11%
DUSA	96%	4%
DUTU	78%	22%
ESSO	76%	24%
ETA	92%	8%

Staff Vaccination clinics will be offered for boosters.

Recommendations and information will be provided for families.

### **Students**

Per Tableau 23.1 % (7,950 students).

6 Months- 4 years old

Pfizer 1st dose, 2nd at 3 weeks, 3rd dose at 8 weeks

Moderna (6 months - 5 yrs.) - 2 dose series - 1 month apart

5-12 years old

Pfizer 2 dose series - 3 weeks apart

Moderna 2 dose series - 1 month apart

13-17 Years old

Pfizer 2 dose series - 3 weeks apart

Moderna - 1 month apart

CDC now recommends that children ages 5 through 11 years receive a booster shot 5 months after their initial Pfizer vaccination series.



Due to procedural changes announced by Shield, additional options are being considered for both staff and/or students.



## **CONTACT TRACING**

- COVID exposure report practice continued
- Symptomatic and positive only
- Nurses tracing students
- Contact tracing team approved with 2 tracers until the end of December



## **COVID PAY FOR STAFF**

- PA 102-0697/HB 1167 allows employees (who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19) to receive either paid administrative leave or sick leave for absences related to COVID-19.
- This is in effect as long as we are under the Executive Order.



## **Symptomatic/Positive Exclusion Timelines**

Student/staff who are identified as having one or more COVID-19-like symptoms or receive a positive test for COVID-19 will be excluded from school.

Students/staff may be eligible for return beginning on day six.

Student/Staff returning on day 6 must:

- Be fever-free for a minimum of 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication;
- Have no episodes of vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours prior to return;
- Have improved COVID-19 symptoms, if any;
- Be able to properly wear a well-fitting mask while indoors and around others; and
- Agree to comply with all mask-wearing requirements through day 10.

## **Symptomatic/Positive Exclusion Timelines**

All require staff and students to have improved symptoms and be fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication and to have had no episodes of vomiting and/or diarrhea for the previous 24 hours of return.

Positive

Return day 6 with mask use days 6-10

Return day 11 with no mask use

## Symptomatic

#### **Choose to test:**

Test <u>negative</u> (can include PCR and home test)

- May return
- No masking requirement

#### **Choose not to test:**

Return day 6

Must wear mask for days 6-10

OR

Unable to comply with well-fitting mask use

Return day is on day 11

## METRICS/CLASSROOM AND SCHOOL CLOSURES

### **Determining Metrics of Mitigation Strategies:**

### **Daily Monitoring**

- 1. Positives or suspected positive cases from the district exposure reporting system
  - a. Districtwide percentages
  - b. Per building
  - c. Allows for mitigation response to be focused on site of concern or district-wide
- 2. Positivity per 100,000
  - a. Kane
  - b. Cook
  - c. DuPage
- 3. Absences with specific illness codes from Infinite Campus Pulled from MyDataZone
- 4. Vaccination rate by county or zip code to encourage participation
  - a. Perhaps adjust thresholds in our other metrics (ex. 5.0%) in areas with lower vaccination rates (Vaccination Data by Zip)

- Fever (100.4°F or higher)
- New onset of moderate to severe headache
- Shortness of breath
- New cough
- Sore throat
- Vomiting/diarrhea
- New loss of sense of taste or smell
- Fatigue from an unknown cause
- Muscle or body aches from an unknown cause
