



- To apply for HOPE/Zell, FAFSA or GSFAPP
- <u>*HOPE/Zell Application</u>

2. Zell Miller:

- 3.7 Core GPA (add .5 weighting for AP courses up to 4.0)
- Students must maintain a 3.3 GPA in college
- Students who drop below the college 3.3 GPA can earn Regular HOPE if their college GPA remains above 3.0
- NOT ROUNDED: 3.6999 will receive HOPE, not Zell Miller
- You must submit your SAT or ACT scores to the GA Student Finance Commission for Zell

1. Is a world language required to graduate from high school?
No, a world language is not required to graduate from high school. Two consecutive years of a world language is a requirement to attend a 4-year college.

2. If a student takes a world language in middle school, does it count toward the 2 consecutive years of a world language required by 4-year colleges?

• Yes, Spanish 1 or any world language taken in middle school for high school credit does count toward the consecutive 2-year language requirement for college. A 3rd year of a language is not required for the HOPE Scholarship. Other rigor courses are available to meet HOPE Rigor requirements.

3. If a student is in a language in 8th grade, will they automatically be placed in the next level freshman year?

• Yes, the student will automatically roll into the next level of the language.

4. Is computer science considered a world language?
The University System of Georgia recognizes Computer Science as a world language. Students must complete 2 courses from the Computer Science pathway. The introductory course – Introduction to Digital Technology/Introduction to Software is not included in these courses. They must be upper level courses beyond the introductory level. 5. When will my student have their schedule?

• Schedules are usually emailed to students the week prior to school starting.

6. Does my student have to stay in the same elective all year? Yes, with very few exceptions, once a selection is made, the student is committed for the year.

7. Does my student have to complete a CTAE pathway?

• Completing a pathway is not a graduation requirement.

8. Are elective choices guaranteed?

• No, students need to select up to 3 alternates in case their first choice is full.

9. What AP (advanced placement – college level) courses are available to freshmen?

• AP Human Geography which is a social studies elective. Freshmen are invited to enroll in the course based on academic requirements.

10. Should a student take Health/Personal Fitness over the summer?

 Summer school information is not available yet.
 Freshmen will take English, Math, Science, Health/Personal Fitness, and 2 electives. Elective choices will determine the need to take summer school classes. An example – a freshman who would like to take band, language, and AP Human Geography. There is a cost to summer school. If a student takes 3 years of ROTC, they do not need to take health/personal fitness.

11. Can my student take weight training in place of personal fitness?

No, the course must be personal fitness.
