The school district will promote and implement quality nutrition and physical education to foster lifelong habits of health eating and physical activity. The plan shall make effective use of school and community resources that equitably serve the needs and interest of all schools.

Nutrition Education

Students are presented information on nutrition in health and consumer education classes. Homer Junior High participated in the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program for the 2023-2024 school. Students was able to taste different fruits and vegetables, in conjunction with that Dr. Williams and LaDonna Cheerne, LSU AgCenter along with Dr. John Bond.
