
## Theory of Action/Office of Schools

- Facilitating, promoting and advocating for the alignment of the U-46 vision, policies, and instructional strategies that impact student growth and equitable outcomes



## **Average Rigor Appraisal Scores** (Scale 1-12)






- · During the second Rigor Appraisal
  - All pillar scores increased since the first Appraisal
  - Conditions for Learning Rigorous Standards had the highest average pillar score (6.1)
  - Activating Student Teams to Achieve the Standard had the lowest average pillar score (3.5)

## Middle of the Year 2024 Taxonomy


### **Observed Taxonomy Levels**







Taxonomy Levels Seen in Student Work



- · During the second Rigor Appraisal,
  - Student work was not observed in 16% of classrooms
  - Retrieval was the taxonomy level seen most frequently in student work (47% of classrooms)
  - · Comprehension was observed in 31% of classrooms
  - Analysis was observed in 5% of classrooms
  - Knowledge Utilization was observed in 1% of classrooms








#### District-wide Average


