Dual Enrollment Steps (complete in order)

- 1. Apply (APPLY NOW!!! APPLY NOW!!!)
 - Submit the DE admissions application on the institution's website
- 2. Send your official transcript online using GAFutures.org
- 3. Send test your test score to the institution: ACT, SAT, or possibly Accuplacer or PSAT score report
- 4. Check your admissions status
 - Use the internal institution website to review and satisfy outstanding requirements
- 5. Email your acceptance letter to your school counselor
- 6. Submit the CCDS participation form to your counselor before the deadline Dual Enrollment Participation Form(click) (You do not need to fill in the schedule section)
 - Summer 2025 Participation: CCSD Participation Form Deadline of March 14, 2025
 - Fall 2025 Participation: CCSD Participation Form Deadline of March 28, 2025
 - Spring 2026 Participation: CCSD Participation Form Deadline of October 11, 2025
- 7. Schedule your new student orientation or advising appointment with your institution to register for your courses.
- 8. Send your school counselor an email with:
 - Copy of your college schedule

Important Points

- Students are limited to 30 hours (approx. 10 classes) funded by the DE program. Once hours have been met the DE program will no longer provide funds. Students can return to EHS once hours run out. Students can continue with DE but MUST self-pay Including all additional fees.
- Full-Time DE is at least 4 classes totaling 12-15 credit hours; Part-Time DE is any combination of DE/high school courses totaling 6 classes.
- Core Academic courses and CTAE courses are approved for DE funding: <u>https://www.gafutures.org/checs/dualenrollment/DECourseDirectory</u>
- Students do not receive program funding to retake/repeat a course.
- Students become ineligible for future DE funding after withdrawing from 2 DE courses or not maintaining the GPA required by the institution.
- ALL withdrawals or course changes with DE <u>MUST</u> first be pre-approved by your school counselor.
