AVID's mission is to close the opportunity gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society.

- Enrollment increased by 10% districtwide 2024-2025 from 1,440 to 1,673 in the AVID elective





Grade Comparison - High School ELA



Magnet Academy GPA Update

Gradually increase the required GPA at the time of application from 2.0 to 2.8 over the course of three application cycles.

This will ensure that we meet the Magnet Schools of America Standards and College and Career Readiness Indicators.

- Application SY 2024-2025 2.2 GPA
- Application SY 2025-2026 2.5 GPA
- Application SY 2026-2027 2.8 GPA

Magnet Academy GPA Update

- Students in 7th grade will need to earn the minimum GPA required to be eligible to apply in the Fall of the following year.
- Students in 8th grade, who were offered and accepted a seat at one of the Magnet Academies, will maintain or improve that GPA by the completion of 8th grade.

Magnet Academy Exit Update

- Students in academies must pass all graduation and/or magnet requirements.
- If a student does not meet graduation and/or magnet requirements, the student's academic placement is adjusted. This adjustment could include exiting the academy program and attending their home school.

Pathways Update
