STUDENTS

Entrance Age

I. Admission

- A. To be eligible for enrollment in Kindergarten for the 2013-2014 school year a child must be five years-of age on or before October 1st of the current school year.
- B. For the 2014-2015 school year and each school year after a child must be five years-of age on or before September 1st of the current school year to be eligible for enrollment in Kindergarten.
- C. To be eligible for enrollment in first grade a child must be six years on or before December 2nd of the current school year.
- D. Students who have completed one year of Kindergarten in a private school are not automatically entitled to admission to first grade when the pupil fails to meet the minimum age requirement.

Such student may be admitted to the first grade at the discretion of the school administration, upon parent's written request, provided the pupil is judged to be emotionally, socially, academically, and physically ready for first grade by the District.

- E. Any child presently attending Kindergarten may be admitted to first grade.
- F. The parent or guardian of a child, prior to admission to Kindergarten or first grade shall present proof to the District evidencing that child is of legal age for admission. The legal evidences of age, in order of desirability, are as follows:

1. Certificate of Birth
2. Baptismal Certificate, duly attested,
3. Passport
4. Affidavit of parent, guardian or custodian of minor.

- G. No child shall be admitted unconditionally to any District school without presentation of evidence that the child has been fully immunized against poliomyelitis, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), measles, mumps, rubella, and Hepatitis B (prior to entering kindergarten and again prior to entering 7th grade) in the manner and with immunizing agents approved by the State Department of Health.
- H. A child may be admitted to school without proof of full immunization on presentation of a written statement by the child's legal parent or guardian to the effect that such immunization is contrary to the personal beliefs of the child, parent or guardian.

A child may be admitted with a temporary medical exemption on condition that required immunizations are obtained at the termination of the exemption. A pupil with a permanent medical exemption is to be admitted unconditionally.

- I. If the District determines that any child seeking first admission is reasonably suspected of having tuberculosis, and the physician issues an order for the examination of such child, the child shall not be granted unconditional admission unless a certificate is produced showing that he/she is free of communicable tuberculosis. Failure of the child to produce a certificate of freedom from communicable tuberculosis within time limits set by the State Department of Health Services shall result in exclusion from the schools of the District until the certificate is obtained and presented, unless the child's parent, guardian or custodian provides an affidavit that the examination required to obtain the certificate is contrary to the child's beliefs. If the Board believes that the child is afflicted with active tuberculosis, the child may be excluded from the schools until the Board is satisfied that the child is not so afflicted.
