Student Assessment Data

 Includes the following three assessments: M-STEP (Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress), MI-Access (Alternate Assessment), and College Board SAT

Presents assessment information for English language arts and mathematics for grades 3 to 8 and 11, and MI-Access science for grades 4, 7, and 11, compared to state averages for all students as well as subgroups of students.

School Accountability Data

 Includes information on schools' performance on various measures such as student proficiency and growth on state assessments, graduation, and attendance rates.
Performance is measured on 0-100 index scales

Additional Targeted Support

Identifies the number and percentage of inexperienced teachers, principals, and other school leaders

- 4. **Communication Plan:** A system for promptly communicating emergency information to all employees and stakeholders.
- 5. **First Aid and Medical Assistance**: Availability of first aid kits and trained personnel to provide immediate medical assistance.
- 6. **Review and Update**: Regular review and updates of the emergency preparedness plan to address new risks and improve response strategies.
