The Patriot Award is dedicated to the lives and spirit of the 5 Seaford High School alumni who died at the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001; Tom Haskell SHS '82, Tim Haskell SHS'85, John Perry SHS '85, Rob Sliwak SHS '77 & Michael Wittenstein SHS '85.

The Award: Five seniors are selected, and each receives a \$2,000 award and is recognized at the Patriot Award Dinner at the Crest Hollow Country Club to be held on Monday, June 23, 2025. To receive the Patriot Award, recipients are required to attend this dinner. All students regardless of academic standing are eligible for the Patriot Award.

Applications will be <u>available online</u>: Monday, January 27.

Application deadline: Friday, February 28.



The Selection: The committee is made up of family members, teachers, community members, past Patriot Award recipients. They will choose 10-15 finalists based on pages 2 and 3 of the Application. Finalists will be interviewed by family members of our honored alumni and the committee chooses 5 recipients based on the application, the references and family interviews. Patriot Award winners are announced at Graduation.

- The **second reference** must be an individual outside of the school (i.e., activity moderator, neighbor, relative, employer, or friend).
- The third reference may be anyone of your choosing.

Please ask your references if you may submit their name as a reference prior to submitting your application. If you are a finalist these individuals will be contacted by the selection committee.

Activities

Up to 5 Club, Sports, School Activities and up to 5 Community Activities

It is the <u>quality</u>, not quantity of your activities that the committee will be evaluating.

List your clubs/activities in the order of importance to you!

For each entry, you will list:

- the name of the activity
- the grade levels you participated in it
- your position within the activity
- the number of hours/weeks you participated in it.

Open-Ended Questions

You will answer EACH of the questions below <u>in 85 words or less</u>. Due to the nature of the application process, any portion of your response beyond 85 words cannot be taken into consideration. **Be clear, concise, and powerful with your words.** Answer the open-ended questions thoughtfully, carefully and sincerely.

- Service, Character, and Commitment are traits of our five lost alumni. How is <u>one</u> of these traits a factor in your life?
- What was your <u>most</u> memorable experience during your high school years and why was this important to you?
- What are your plans after graduation and *what type of person do you aspire to be*?
